11. RICHMOND-VANCOUVER RAPID BUS PROJECT – FOLLOW-UP REPORT

(Report: Dec. 18/98; File No.: 6520-02-01)

- That the Richmond-Vancouver Rapid Bus Project be endorsed and carried forward to the detailed design and property negotiation phase, for the commencement of construction in 1999.
- That BC Transit be requested to report to Council on the following items, prior to finalizing the detailed design plan for the Richmond-Vancouver Rapid Bus Project:
 - (a) Locations of the Rapid Bus stations and alignment, and all road and traffic improvements required to accommodate the introduction of the Rapid Bus service, including new intersections, provision of "U"-turns, and other traffic management changes;
 - (b) Details of the Rapid Bus stations and streetscape design over the entire cross-section of No. 3 Road:



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- (c) A construction traffic management plan with appropriate measures to mitigate the impacts of construction on road users and businesses;
- (d) Exact location(s) of the City Centre Transit Exchange(s) and the supporting road and traffic improvements;
- (e) An assessment of the various implications (including access, streetscape, and overall traffic operations) of eliminating the Frontage Road on the west side of No. 3 Road between Alderbridge Way and Firbridge Way to accommodate the introduction of Rapid Bus;
- A final detailed design of No. 3 Road widening along the entire Rapid Bus route upon further discussions and negotiations with the affected business owners;
- (g) The outcome of the parking inventory and utilisation study concerning the provision of on-street parking spaces at Anderson Road; and
- (h) The outcome of the consultation with the Richmond Committee on Disability.
- (i) The integration of the present and tuture 'park and ride' facilities with RapidBus and the newly designed local transit services.
- 3. That BC Transit be requested to continue consultation with all affected No. 3 Road businesses during the detailed design phase of the project, to solicit input into developing the final detailed design plan for the Rapid Bus Project, and in particular to address the various issues identified in Recommendation 2 above.
- 4. That staff be directed to examine the feasibility of establishing an interim North Loop Road which can be implemented in the short term, to improve traffic circulation for businesses located along the northern section of No. 3 Road and to compliment the introduction of the Rapid Bus service in Richmond.

- (9) That no funding from the 1999 Capital Budget be expended until Council has completed the detailed project and funding source review and that this review be completed no later than February 15, 1999.
