The General Purposes Committee, at its meeting held on January 7th, 2002, considered the attached report, and recommends as follows:

Committee Recommendation

- (1) *That the Richmond Committee on Disability be awarded an additional grant in the amount of \$15,500, for a total of \$17,000; and that RADAT and the Steveston Community Society be awarded grants in the amount of \$7,500 and \$4,000 respectively, which represent the amounts awarded to these organizations in 2001.*
- (2) *That the report (dated December 19th, 2001, from the Manager, Customer Service), regarding 2002 Richmond City Grants, be referred to staff for review, and that an amount be included in the Grants Budget for the Richmond Christmas Hamper Fund.*

- (1) That the grant amounts (identified in the report dated December 19th, 2001, from the Manager, Customer Services) for Health and Social Services applicants, be approved and the cheques disbursed for a total of \$239,700; and
- (2) The grants (identified in the report dated December 19th, 2001, from the Manager, Customer Services) for Cultural; Community Promotion and Summer Program applicants be approved and the cheques disbursed for a total of \$61,300.

Staff Report

ORIGIN

City Council has the authority for providing financial assistance to community organizations under the Local Government Act. The City of Richmond Grants Policy (Policy 3705) outlines the principles and processes by which the grants are to be allocated.

The Staff Grants Review Committee (Mr. Kari Huhtala and Ms. Anne Stevens) has reviewed the applications and recommends the allocations before you.

ANALYSIS

Advertisements were placed in the local newspapers advising the Richmond community of the grant process. Those who requested applications received them. The closing date for all applications was Friday October 12, 2001.

This year there were a total of thirty-eight (38) applicants. Of the 38 applicants, three came in after the October 12, 2001 deadline. The organizations that were late in applying were:

- RADAT;
- Steveston Community Society and
- Richmond Christmas Hamper.

Staff has not recommended funding for these three groups for 2002.

Another three organizations that applied for 2002 Grants were considered to be Category 2 in 2001. In the policy, Category 2 applicants who receive funding would not be eligible for funding for two subsequent years. The three organizations, which fall in this category, are:

- Women's Resource Centre;
- Hamilton Community Association
- Richmond Youth Concert Band.

Staff is recommending they be denied funding for the 2002 Year Grants so as not to compromise the integrity of the policy.

There were a few applicants that received funding last year but did not apply for a 2002 grant. Those agencies are:

- Always There for You – Home Support
- East Richmond Community Association
- Johnston School of Highland Dance
- Touchtone Family Association

The remaining applicants were reviewed and the summary sheets are attached with recommendations for Council consideration

Summary Review

The attached financial summary sheets (Appendix 1 and 2) provide further details. A summary of applications follows.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The attached summary sheets detail that the total grant funding for 2002 is recommended for \$301,000. This is comprised of Health, Social Services and other at \$239,700 and Cultural and Community/Summer Programs at \$61,300. The year 2002 operating budget has funding appropriated of \$316,500 which provides adequate funding to meet the staff recommendations.

CONCLUSION

The City Grant program is a way for the City to provide funding and assistance to organizations that provide required services to various residents of Richmond and who also meet the policy criteria. The amount of funds recommended for Council consideration is \$301,000 leaving \$15,500. As all the requests have been met at the same level as 2001 and the policy guidelines have been adhered to, the remaining funding is available to Council to use at their discretion.
