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Staff Report

ORIGIN

City Council has the authority for providing financial assistance to community organizations under the Local Government Act. The City of Richmond Grants Policy (Policy 3705) (Attachment 1) outlines the principles and processes by which the grants are to be allocated.

The Grants report was referred back to staff to ensure the RCD received \$ 17,000 and the three applicants who were late (Richmond Christmas Hamper Fund, RADAT and Steveston Society) received same level as last year, without increasing 2002 grants budget. This report reflects those adjustments.

ANALYSIS

Advertisements were placed in the local newspapers advising the Richmond community of the grant process. Those who requested applications received them. The closing date for all applications was Friday October 12,2001.

This year there were a total of thirty-nine (39) applicants. Of the 39 applicants, three came in after the October 12,2001 deadline. The organizations that were late in applying were:

- RADAT;
- Steveston Community Society and
- Richmond Christmas Hamper Fund.

Staff has made provisions for the late applicants except for the Kinsmen Nature Comes to Light as their application arrived January 7, 2002 approximately three months after the deadline.

Another three organizations that applied for 2002 Grants where considered to be Category 2 in 2001. In the policy, Category 2 applicants who receive funding would not be eligible for funding for two subsequent years. The three organizations, which fall in this category, are:

- Family Childcare Society
- Hamilton Community Association
- Richmond Youth Concert Band.

Staff is recommending they be denied funding for the 2002 Year Grants so as not to compromise the integrity of the policy.

The remaining applicants were reviewed along with recommendations from Committee. The summary sheets are attached with recommendations for Council consideration.

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Summary Review

The attached financial summary sheets (Appendix 1 and 2) provide further details. A summary of applications follows.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The attached summary sheet (Attachment 2) details that the total grants funding for 2002 is \$316,500. This is comprised of Health, Social Services and other at \$252,200 and Cultural and Community/Summer Programs at \$64,300. The year 2002 operating budget has funding appropriated of \$316,500, which provides adequate funding to meet the staff recommendations.

CONCLUSION

The City Grant program is a way for the City to provide funding and assistance to organizations that provide required services to various residents of Richmond and who also meet the policy criteria. The amount of funds recommended for Council consideration is \$316,500.

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RICHMOND GRANTS POLICY

GENERAL PRINCIPLES:

The City of Richmond supports the enhancement of a positive quality of life for all its residents, and the Council recognizes that one means of helping to achieve this goal is through an annual grants program.

Applications from non-profit or registered charitable organizations and/or groups are eligible for a City grant on the basis that they:

- •Offer projects, programs, services or events that have a demonstrated need in the community;
- Provide the greatest benefits to the highest number of Richmond residents;
- •Exercise co-ordination and co-operation with other groups to prevent duplication of projects, programs, services or events;
- Provide evidence of having sought funding from a variety of sources;
- Promote volunteer participation and citizen involvement;
- Apply a "user pay" philosophy, where applicable;
- Use innovative approaches and techniques in addressing community issues;
- Provide documentation supporting the financial need for funding, including, but not limited to, the current financial statements of the applicant;
- •Show real and financial need and demonstrate the impact that would occur following non-funding from the City;

and on the understanding that:

- •Not all organizations meeting these general principles will automatically receive a grant or grant increase;
- Approval of a grant by the City in any particular year should not be viewed as an automatic ongoing source of annual funding;
- Grant renewals are not automatic, nor is any increase in funds;
- •Grant approvals in a particular year, do not guarantee that grant requests in subsequent years will be successful;
- •Only one application per year will be accepted per organization.

EXCLUSIONS FROM ELIGIBILITY FOR CITY GRANT:

- Applications from individuals;
- Activities which are restricted to people of specific religious or ethnic groups;
- Annual fund-raising campaigns, form letters requests or telephone campaigns;
- Building funds or capital construction campaigns;
- Debt retirement;
- Expenses related to attendance at seminars, workshops, symposiums, or conferences;
- Agencies which primarily fund other organizations.

GRANT REVIEW CONSIDERATIONS

Not all organizations meeting the criteria will automatically receive a grant. Grant allocations are dependent on the Grants budget established by City Council. In reviewing grant applications and preparing recommendations for grant allocations, Council may give primary consideration to the following factors:

- Basic eligibility and demonstrated organizational efficiency, effectiveness and stability;
- Number of Richmond residents served;
- Quality of service;
- Financial need of the organization;
- Community interaction;
- Role and number of volunteers;
- Use of existing community services and facilities;
- Local input into governance.

DEFINITIONS OF ELIGIBLE GRANT CATEGORIES:

Applicable category for any application to be determined by Council.

<u>Category 1</u> applicants must be deemed to be providing unique and essential services to the community of Richmond. Applicants must demonstrate how their services fit under this designation. Applicants who are deemed to be Category 1 applicants may apply for funding in subsequent years; and

<u>Category 2</u> applicants who receive funding would not be eligible to apply or receive funding for two subsequent years.

2. Operating Assistance

Regular operating expenses or core budgets of established organizations, including supplies and equipment; heat; light; telephone; photocopying; rent; and administrative support salaries.

3. Projects

One-time-only projects which respond to health, social and cultural needs within Richmond, have a specific set of goals and objectives, and which have a defined start and finishing date.

4. Programs and Services

Ongoing programs and services which contribute to the health and social well being of Richmond residents, or which contribute to the general interest and advantage of the City.

5. Events (Community Promotion)

Events which enhance and contribute to the cultural life of Richmond, which promote community involvement and spirit, and which have a defined start and finishing date (but may also be held annually), and which promote Richmond outside the City.

6. Council Discretion

Council may, at its discretion, award grants to groups which offer a service deemed by Council to be of value to the City, or to community committees whose mandate is to function for the good of the City and its residents.
