Staff Report

Origin

At the General Purposes Committee on Monday January 20 the 2003 Grants were presented to Council for their consideration. This item created discussion around the following referrals:

- 1. Recommendations on how a better level of coordination should be achieved between local organizations in such areas as volunteer training;
- 2. Require in grant application, confirmation that the previous year's grant monies was expended as requested;
- 3. Require the applicant to provide details to support their claim that the grant was required as a result of downloading from the Federal or Provincial governments;
- 4. Whether long term funding for the Richmond Committee on Disability and the Richmond Therapeutic Equestrian Society was to be included as part of the City's operating budget;
- 5. Caring for kids whether there is a duplication resources within existing service groups with those provided by Caring for Kids;
- 6. Big Sisters, if a letter sent to this organization warning them about the consequences of submitting late grant applications;
- 7. Pathways provide information on the mission and purpose of this organization; also the cost of providing lunches for the members;
- 8. Richmond Chinese Mental Health Support Group provide information on their mission and purpose; also additional information on their application
- 9. Canada Chinese Opera Association and Peking opera Society of Richmond provide additional information on the purpose of their applications
- 10. Provide comments on the funding surpluses which some organizations have and whether these surpluses should have an effect on their success in obtaining grants from the City and provide a rationale for the Gateway Theatre and the Richmond Nature Park submitting applications for and being recommended to receive grants, when these organizations already obtain funding through the City's operating budget

This report will deal with these referrals and the recommendations for the 2003 grants.

Findings Of Fact

The City of Richmond Grants Policy (3075) (Attachment1) outlines the principles and processes by which the grants are to be allocated.

This year there were a total of 37 grant applications with a total requested amount of \$850,438. The summary sheets (appendix) for all applications reflect "Purpose of the Organizations" and the amount of unallocated funds for each agency.

This report will address the referrals one at a time.

1. Co-ordination of Services - The co-ordination of the various service agencies within Richmond is not only a concern of the City but also of the Health Board. The City of Richmond has an opportunity to utilize a well-established committee to deal with this request. The RCSAC has representation from the various agencies in Richmond who provide a variety of services. It is suggested that the Social Planning staff whom liase with the RCSAC, bring this item forward and that this request become a goal of this committee for 2003. An inventory of the services along with potential duplication can be identified. Once the services are identified a co-ordinated service delivery system for Richmond could be put in place.

<u>Volunteer Training</u> - The Volunteer Centre currently offers a number of services to various agencies in Richmond. The following outlines some of those services:

- Consultation services to community groups who require assistance in the
 development of their volunteer program. Specifically, they assist in designing job
 descriptions, in house training programs and recognition and evaluation programs.
 Presently they are working with the Cities emergency program to standardize a
 volunteer management model to ensure both organizations do not duplicate
 services, utilize the appropriate resources and engage more community
 volunteers.
- A training program for volunteers to develop their skills and knowledge of volunteering.

Many Richmond agencies currently take advantage of the services offered by the Volunteer Centre, either with recruitment or training. As always, though, some specific training would be required by each agency once the volunteer has successfully been recruited.

- 2. Within the grant application form there is an area, which asks for a detailed accounting of how the previous years monies was spent. Staff review this annually to ensure the money was spent accordingly. Other areas can be added to address some outstanding questions, if required.
- 3. In the 2004 application form a new request will be required of all agencies, requesting more detail on the downloading issue.

- 4. Therapeutic Riding and Committee on Disability In 2003 the Richmond Committee on Disability received \$70,000 from the Casino fund and the Therapeutic Riding received \$17,000 from the grant fund.
 - The Richmond Committee on Disability and the Therapeutic Riding, are not part of the 2004 operating budget but the Recreation Dept has suggested including these two groups under the additional level requests and a report to that effect will be coming to Council during the 2004 budget process. Should the additional level requests not be feasible, the grants process would the appropriate venue as with other organizations in the City.
- 5. Caring for Kids is a program, which would provide additional services to youth within the City, but presently the City provides funding in a number of areas for youth. The youth coordinators in each of the Community Centres, School Liaison Officers, and youth workers in Richmond are directly funded by the City. Out side agencies such as Big Brothers and Big Sisters along with Youth Services, receive a grant from the City on an annual basis. The school board also has counsellors and peer counsellors in the system for youth.
 - Caring about Kids is similar to Big Brother and Sisters yet does not require the same time commitment. As one volunteer stated, "this program goes in to the schools and takes the form of tutoring session" Caring about Kids is a worthwhile program but staff feel the City has provided sufficient services for youth in 2003.
- 6. <u>Big Sisters</u> late application. A letter was sent to a couple of groups last year but unfortunately Big Sisters were missed.
- 7. Pathways Of the \$17,500, which was given to Pathways \$5500, went to offset lunches for the members. The remaining money went to cover administrative costs.
- 8. <u>Richmond Chinese Mental Health Group</u> this group provides information counselling, and resources for the Asian population requiring assistance. They also link closely with other mental health service providers in Richmond. This group's services are well used by the community.
- 9. <u>Canadian Chinese Opera Society and Peking Opera Society</u> As they are doing a joint venture staff have recommended \$1000 for their performance.
- 10. <u>Gateway and Nature Park</u> both these organizations receive funding from the City operating budget but their applications were considered on the merit of the program presented as a benefit to the City. Staff feel that if a policy were instated 'that any organization receiving operating funds through the City operating budget should not be considered for grant money' then all organizations should be treated the same.

Through this review there are 5 recommended adjustments to the 2003 grants as previously proposed to Committee:

- Hamilton Community Association adjustment from \$700 to \$500, which is the same level as 2002.
- Rmd Youth Concert Band was a Category 2 in 2001 and based on policy should wait for 2 consecutive years before receiving funding.
- Rmd Society for Community Living was reduced to from \$2500 to \$2000 due to the large surplus.
- Chinese Mental Health was increased from \$2000 to \$5000.
- Peking Opera and Canadian Opera now recommended for \$1000 for their joint performance.

The Grants policy does state that applicants who are late will not be considered but staff has made provisions for two of the three applicants (Richmond Singers (denied), Chinese Mental Health Support Group and Big Sisters, should Council wish to grant these funds.

The attached financial summary sheet (Appendix1) and the application summary sheets (Appendix 2) provide further details for Council review.

Financial Impact

Due to budget issues staff has reduced the proposed allocation from \$316,500 to\$292,550. This is comprised of \$222,750 for Health and Social Services; \$18,800 to Cultural and Community Promotions and \$51,000 to Richmond Summer Programs. This is an increase of \$2600 from the previous report presented to Committee.

Conclusion

In order to deal with the issue of overlap and shortage of dollars staff is recommending that the RCSAC provide an inventory of services, determine the overlaps and implement a strategy to ensure co-ordination with all groups when applying for Richmond funding.

In 2004, staff will adjust the City grants application to address questions dealing with government shortfalls and collaboration.

Staff is recommending for Council consideration a distribution of \$292,550 for the 2003 year.

RICHMOND GRANTS POLICY

GENERAL PRINCIPLES:

The City of Richmond supports the enhancement of a positive quality of life for all its residents, and the Council recognizes that one means of helping to achieve this goal is through an annual grants program.

Applications from non-profit or registered charitable organizations and/or groups are eligible for a City grant on the basis that they:

- •Offer projects, programs, services or events that have a demonstrated need in the community;
- Provide the greatest benefits to the highest number of Richmond residents;
- •Exercise co-ordination and co-operation with other groups to prevent duplication of projects, programs, services or events;
- Provide evidence of having sought funding from a variety of sources;
- Promote volunteer participation and citizen involvement;
- Apply a "user pay" philosophy, where applicable;
- •Use innovative approaches and techniques in addressing community issues:
- Provide documentation supporting the financial need for funding, including, but not limited to, the current financial statements of the applicant;
- •Show real and financial need and demonstrate the impact that would occur following non-funding from the City;

and on the understanding that:

- •Not all organizations meeting these general principles will automatically receive a grant or grant increase;
- Approval of a grant by the City in any particular year should not be viewed as an automatic ongoing source of annual funding;
- •Grant renewals are not automatic, nor is any increase in funds;
- •Grant approvals in a particular year, do not guarantee that grant requests in subsequent years will be successful;
- •Only one application per year will be accepted per organization.

EXCLUSIONS FROM ELIGIBILITY FOR CITY GRANT:

- Applications from individuals;
- •Activities which are restricted to people of specific religious or ethnic groups;
- •Annual fund-raising campaigns, form letters requests or telephone campaigns;
- Building funds or capital construction campaigns;
- Debt retirement;
- •Expenses related to attendance at seminars, workshops, symposiums, or conferences:
- Agencies which primarily fund other organizations.

GRANT REVIEW CONSIDERATIONS

Not all organizations meeting the criteria will automatically receive a grant. Grant allocations are dependent on the Grants budget established by City Council. In reviewing grant applications and preparing recommendations for grant allocations, Council may give primary consideration to the following factors:

- Basic eligibility and demonstrated organizational efficiency, effectiveness and stability;
- Number of Richmond residents served;
- Quality of service;
- Financial need of the organization;
- Community interaction;
- Role and number of volunteers;
- Use of existing community services and facilities:
- Local input into governance.

DEFINITIONS OF ELIGIBLE GRANT CATEGORIES:

1. Applicable category for any application to be determined by Council.

<u>Category 1</u> applicants must be deemed to be providing unique and essential services to the community of Richmond. Applicants must demonstrate how their services fit under this designation. Applicants who are deemed to be Category 1 applicants may apply for funding in subsequent years; and

<u>Category 2</u> applicants who receive funding would not be eligible to apply or receive funding for two subsequent years.

2. Operating Assistance

Regular operating expenses or core budgets of established organizations, including supplies and equipment; heat; light; telephone; photocopying; rent; and administrative support salaries.

3. Projects

One-time-only projects which respond to health, social and cultural needs within Richmond, have a specific set of goals and objectives, and which have a defined start and finishing date.

4. Programs and Services

Ongoing programs and services which contribute to the health and social well being of Richmond residents, or which contribute to the general interest and advantage of the City.

5. Events (Community Promotion)

Events which enhance and contribute to the cultural life of Richmond, which promote community involvement and spirit, and which have a defined start and finishing date (but may also be held annually), and which promote Richmond outside the City.

6. Council Discretion

Council may, at its discretion, award grants to groups which offer a service deemed by Council to be of value to the City, or to community committees whose mandate is to function for the good of the City and its residents.
