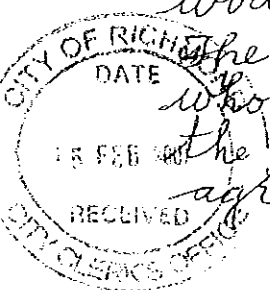

Forty years ago when my daughter was six, I gave my daughter a certificate which stated that she would receive one hundred dollars when she was nineteen if she did not smoke before that date. I told her that I would give her the hundred dollars plus six per cent interest for each year from the time that she was six until she was nineteen. When she was six there was a story about what I was doing in the press and on Rogers TV. Several people telephoned me and said that it was a good idea. Some people said six percent interest was high for a single parent. I know that one hundred dollars is a small amount now.

I am going to go to Coast Capital Savings to see what someone would say about my idea. If Coast Capital Savings or some other group would like to give one hundred dollars for this idea, I would be delighted. The money would be held in trust for a child from the time he or she is six until the person reaches the age of nineteen. The chairperson of the school board could give the money to one of the people who received the money who would be chosen by lot. The certificates would be numbered one to one hundred. The parents or guardians of the children who received the certificate would sign on the back of the certificate that they would agree to give one hundred dollars to their



son or daughter plus<sup>2</sup> six percent annual interest when they reached nineteen. The person whose name was drawn would receive an extra one hundred dollars in addition to the amount he or she would receive from a parent or parents.

If the school board agreed with my idea, I would like them to photocopy one hundred copies and leave out my daughter's name. I would change the name, Ann Landers, to N. Trigglesworth or another donor. I would like the Richmond School Board chairperson to sign it.

Every year I get my photograph in the media. Last January 2006, I was in Metro. I do not get paid for any of work which I do to try to prevent people smoking. My ambition is to stamp out smoking, drinking alcohol, using illegal drugs and gambling.

I would be pleased if I could find three people to head up a campaign against smoking, drinking alcohol, using illegal drugs and gambling. I would like a teacher in the next month when the weather is better to pose near my non smoking sign. Teachers and police officers are respected in the community. I would like a picture in the B.C. Teachers Federation magazine of a teacher beside my non smoking sign.

I once met a lady who had read about me going to give my daughter money for not smoking. She said that her grandmother gave her brother and her one thousand <sup>dollars</sup> each when they reached nineteen because they had not started smoking.

When I had a non smoking float in the Salmon Festival Parade, I saw a vehicle hitched to a trailer. There was a

saw the plain clothed policeman who was  
driving the vehicle smoking.

I said to him, "You are a disgrace  
because you are smoking."

He said, "I have been smoking since  
I was sixteen and I am not going to stop."

So I telephoned the Stest Vancouver  
Police Department. I received a reply within  
twelve hours. I was told the police officer  
was a member of the Vancouver Police  
Department. I telephoned the Vancouver  
Police Department but received no reply  
within three days. Then I telephoned the  
office of the mayor of Vancouver and spoke  
to the secretary. She nearly cut me off  
for repeating what the police officer said.  
Then I sent a fax to the mayor's office.  
I received an apology from the sergeant  
at the Internal Affairs Department. The police  
officer who was driving the vehicle was  
retired.
