The General Purposes Committee, at its meeting held on Monday, February 21st, 2005, considered the attached report, and recommends as follows:

Committee Recommendation

That the 2005 City Grant Program support the following:

- (1) The organizations in the Health and Social Services and Others category be awarded the recommended grant amount and the cheques disbursed for a total of \$202,000; and that:
 - (a) an additional \$71,500 be awarded to Richmond Addiction Services for the provision of a Youth Outreach Counsellor; and*
 - (b) the grant to Richmond Family Services be increased by \$7,000.**
- (2) The organizations in the Cultural, Community Promotions and Summer Programs category be awarded the recommended grant amount and the cheques disbursed for a total of \$104,100.*

Staff Report

Origin

City Council has the authority to provide financial assistance to community organizations under the Local Government Act. The City of Richmond Grants Policy (Policy 3705) outlines the principles and processes by which the grants are to be allocated.

A Staff Grants Review Committee has reviewed the applications and recommends the allocations before you.

Analysis

Advertisements were placed in the local newspapers advising the community of the 2005 City Grant Program. Those who requested applications received them. The closing date for all applications was Friday, October 15, 2004.

This year there were a total of fifty two (52) applicants. Of the 52 applicants, two came in after the October 15, 2004 deadline. The organizations that were late in applying were *Richmond Intermediate Care Society – Rosewood Manor* and *Chinese Mental Wellness Association of Canada*. Although it states in the application form “Late applications will not be considered” staff have reviewed these applications and made their recommendations for Council consideration.

The Policy states Category 1 applicants as “providing unique and essential services to the community of Richmond”. Applicants who are deemed to be Category 1 may apply for funding in subsequent years. Category 2 applicants who received funding are not eligible to apply or receive funding for two subsequent years.

In 2005 the following applications (12) are new and have never applied to the City for a grant.

2. BC Ataxia Society
3. Friend 2 Friend
4. Richmond Intermediate Care Society- Rosewood Manor
5. Canadian Parents for French
6. Centre for Integration for African Immigrants
7. Chinese Federation of Commerce of Canada

10. Pangaea Arts Society
11. Richmond Artists Guild
12. Richmond Fire Department Pipe Band

The "Summary of Requests for 2005 Grants Program" (Attachment 1) summarizes requests and recommended amounts along with staff rationales. The individual summary sheets (Attachment 2) give an overview of each applications.

This year the budget for City Grants is \$316,500 and the recommended amount to allocate is \$306,100. The remaining \$10,400 which has been budgeted but not allocated, could be used at Council's discretion.

Financial Impact

Staff have recommended that the total grant funding for 2005 be \$306,100. Health, Social Services and Other at \$202,000 and Cultural, Community Promotions and Summer Programs at \$104,100.

The 2005 budget has the appropriate funding level to meet the 2005 Grant Program recommendations.

Conclusion

The City Grants Program is a way for the City to provide funding and assistance to organizations that meet the policy criteria by providing unique and essential services to the community of Richmond.

The staff review process has allowed for each application to be reviewed and an appropriate amount recommended for Council consideration.
