2004 Grant Program

The General Purposes Committee, at its meeting held on Monday, March 1st, 2004, considered the attached report, and recommends as follows:

Committee Recommendation

- (1) That the grant request from the Steveston Community Society for a float be referred to staff to investigate and report to the General Purposes Committee on the question of the float in relation to the City's 125 Year Anniversary celebrations.
- (2) That the proposed grant to the Richmond Youth Services be referred to staff to obtain additional information on that organization's current activities, and on any duplication of services which were occurring for which the City was being asked to provide funding.
- (3) That the grant to the City Centre Community Association for administration of the summer programs involving City youth workers be divided amongst the seven community centres.
- (4) That staff examine the role of RADAT and the services which that organization provides to the community with respect to alcohol and drug addictions, to:
 - (a) determine how far reaching the programs offered by RADAT were within the community; and
 - (b) provide information on the cost involved in running the programs and staff implications.
- (5) That the proposed grant to the Richmond Nature Park be referred to staff to obtain information on (i) the purpose for the funding being requested, and (ii) the nature of the surplus held by the Nature Park.
- (6) That grants be awarded (as identified in Attachment 1 to the report dated March 4th, 2004, and as amended to reflect a grant to RADAT in the amount of \$8,500):
 - (a) for Health and Social Services, and the cheques disbursed for a total of \$170,500; and
 - (b) Cultural, Community Promotions and Summer Programs, and the cheques disbursed for a total of \$67,100;

and that grants to the Richmond Youth Service Agency and the Nature Park be deferred until the outcome of the referral motions to staff.

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Staff Report

Origin

City Council has the authority to provide financial assistance to community organizations under the Local Government Act. The City of Richmond Grants Policy (Policy 3705 – Attachment 4) outlines the principles and processes by which the grants are to be allocated.

A Staff Grants Review Committee (Mr. Kari Huhtala, Ms. Anne Stevens, and Mrs. Meena Tagger) has reviewed the applications and recommends the allocations before you.

Analysis

Advertisements were placed in the local newspapers advising the community of the grant process. Those who requested applications received them. The closing date for all applications was Friday October 10, 2003.

This year there were a total of thirty four (34) applicants. Of the 34 applicants, one came in after the October 10, 2003 deadline. The organization that was late in applying was the Richmond Alcohol & Drug Action Team. Staff has not recommended any funding for this year as it states in the application form "Late applications will be <u>not</u> be considered".

The Policy states <u>Category 1</u> applicants as "providing unique and essential services to the community of Richmond". Applicants who are deemed to be Category 1 may apply for funding in subsequent years whereas <u>Category 2</u> applicants are not eligible to apply or receive funding for two subsequent years.

The Canada Chinese Opera Association previously Peking Opera Society received funding in 2003 under Category 2 In the policy, Category 2 applicants who receive funding would not be eligible for funding for two subsequent years and staff have not recommended funding for 2004.

In 2004 there were 6 new applicants. Those applicants are:

- 1. British Columbia Choral Foundation.
- 2. Richmond Association for Montessori (RAM).
- 3. Christian Communications Canada.
- 4. Multicultural Seniors Society
- 5. VIP Club of Richmond.
- 6. Enoch Youth Outreach Society.

There were a number of applicants that received funding in 2003 but did not apply for a 2004 grant. Those agencies are:

- Richmond Art Gallery.
- > Richmond Marine Rescue Society.
- > Big Brothers of Greater Vancouver.
- > Canadian Red Cross Prevention Services.

- > Richmond Hospice Association.
- Richmond Society for Community Living.
- > Richmond Therapeutic Equestrian Society.

The attached individual and comprehensive summary sheets (Attachment 1& 2) summarize the requests for each application the staff rationale and the financial status of the organizations.

The Steveston Community Society requested \$40,000 for their Salmon Festival Float. Staff did not grant any money towards this float as Council recommended staff to consider the City of Richmond Festival Float in this year Grant Program. (General Purposes Committee Attachment 3). This year the budget for City Grants is \$316,500 and recommended amount allocated is \$230,400. The remaining \$86,100 which has been budgeted but not allocated, could be used for the 125th anniversary float or at Council's discretion.

Financial Impact

The attached summary sheet (Attachment 1) shows that the total grant funding for 2004 is \$230,400. This is comprised of Health, Social Services and Other at \$179,000 and Cultural and Community/Summer Programs at \$51,400. The City also provides roughly 1.2 million in subsidies through permissive tax exemptions; lease reductions and contributions to committee expenses.

The 2004 budget has the appropriate funding level to meet grant recommendations. Staff were cognisant of budgetary restraints leaving \$86,100 for Council's discretion.

Conclusion

The City Grants program is a way for the City to provide funding and assistance to organizations that provide required services to various residents of Richmond and who also meet the policy criteria.

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POLICY 3705:

It is Council policy that:

The principles on which grant funding will be approved are as follows:

A. GENERAL PRINCIPLES:

The City of Richmond supports the enhancement of a positive quality of life for all its residents, and the Council recognizes that one method of helping to achieve this goal is through an annual grants program.

Applications from non-profit or registered charitable organizations and/or groups are eligible for a City grant on the basis that they:

- offer projects, programs, services or events which have a demonstrated need in the community;
- provide the greatest benefits to the largest number of Richmond residents;
- exercise co-ordination and co-operation with other groups to prevent duplication of projects, programs, services or events;
- provide evidence of having sought funding from a variety of sources;
- promote volunteer participation and citizen involvement;
- apply a "user pay" philosophy, where applicable;
- use innovative approaches and techniques in addressing community issues;
- provide documentation supporting the financial need for funding, including, but not limited, to the current financial statements of the applicant;
- show real and financial need, and demonstrate the impact that would occur following non-funding from the City;

and on the understanding, that:

- Not all organizations meeting these general principles will automatically receive a grant or grant increase.
- Approval of a grant by the City in any particular year should not be viewed as an automatic ongoing source of annual funding. Grant renewals are not automatic,



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nor is any increase in funds. Grant approvals in a particular year, do not guarantee that grant requests in subsequent years will be successful.

Only one application per year will be accepted per organization.

B. DEFINITIONS OF ELIGIBLE GRANT CATEGORIES:

1. Category 1 and Category 2 Applicants – Applicable category for any application to be determined by Council.

Applicants may apply for Category 1 or Category 2 designation as follows:

<u>Category 1</u> applicants must be deemed to be providing unique and essential services to the community of Richmond. Applicants must demonstrate how their services fit under this designation. Applicants who are deemed to be Category 1 may apply for funding in subsequent years; and

<u>Category 2</u> applicants who receive funding would not be eligible to apply or receive funding for two subsequent years.

2. Operating Assistance

Regular operating expenses or core budgets of established organizations, including supplies and equipment, heat, light, telephone, photocopying, rent, and administrative support salaries.

3. Projects

One-time-only projects which respond to health, social and cultural needs within Richmond, must have a specific set of goals and objectives, and have a defined start and finish date.

4. Programs and Services

Ongoing programs and services which contribute to the health and social well-being of Richmond residents, or which contribute to the general interest and advantage of the City.

5. Events (Community Promotion)

Events which enhance and contribute to the cultural life of Richmond, which promote community involvement and spirit, and which have a defined start and finishing date (but may also be held annually), and which promote Richmond outside the City.



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6. Council Discretion

Council may, at its discretion, award grants to groups which offer a service deemed by Council to be of value to the City, or to community committees whose mandate is to function for the good of the City and its residents.

C. EXCLUSIONS FROM ELIGIBILITY FOR CITY GRANT:

- Applications from individuals
- Activities which are restricted to people of specific religious or ethnic groups
- Annual fund-raising campaigns, form letter requests or telephone campaigns
- Building funds or capital construction campaigns
- Debt retirement
- Expenses related to attendance at seminars, workshops, symposiums, or conferences
- Agencies which primarily fund other organizations

D. GRANTS REVIEW CONSIDERATIONS

Not all organizations meeting the criteria will automatically receive a grant. Grant allocations are dependent on the Grants budget established by City Council.

In reviewing grant applications and preparing recommendations for grant allocations, Council may give primary consideration to the following factors:

- Basic eligibility and demonstrates organizational efficiency, effectiveness and stability.
- numbers of Richmond residents served
- quality of service
- financial need of the organization
- community interaction
- · role and number of volunteers
- use of existing community services and facilities
- local input into governance
