Committee Recommendation

Code of Conduct

This code applies to all staff who work for and/or represent the Richmond Fire-Rescue Department. All staff shall:

- 1. Be responsible for their actions and understand that conduct that breaches this code will result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment.
- 2. Respect the rights of all staff to work in a safe, welcoming, inclusive and non discriminatory environment.
- 3. Behave professionally. Be respectful of others' rights and be courteous, especially when there is disagreement.
- Respect and follow the chain of command.
- 5. Place public interest above individual, group or special interests, and honour the public trust in all actions.
- 6. Act with honesty and integrity. Abide by and uphold all rules and regulations and assist/encourage others to do the same.
- 7. Communicate appropriately.
- 8. Operate and use equipment, supplies and facilities as directed and in accordance with regulations.
