Staff Report

Origin

On December 14, 2001 a Soil Conservation Permit Application was submitted to the City from Jani and Eric Karls. The Land Reserve Commission by resolution #35/2002 approved this application on February 2, 2002. A copy of the letter from the Land Reserve Commission is appended as "Attachment 1." It is now appropriate for this soil permit application be considered by Richmond City Council. It is noted that these applications were previously routed to Planning Committee however they are now sent to Council through the Community Safety Committee.

Analysis

The purpose of the application is for the placement of approximately 1000 cubic metres of fill for the installation of a septic field associated with a new house being built on the site.

Staff have investigated all the relevant issues involved with this application. The staff analysis, as documented in "Attachment 2", does not reveal any serious problems and therefore staff supports the issuing of this permit. For clarity a section map indicating the parcel of land under discussion is included as "Attachment 3."

Financial Impact

None.

Conclusion

The Land Reserve Commission reviewed the application and agreed to the deposition of fill, in compliance with plans submitted with the application, for the installation of a septic field. The placement of soil required for the construction of a house and new barn on the site has been ruled exempt by the Commission.

This is to advise that pursuant to the Soil Conservation Act (the "Act") the Land Reserve Commission (the "Commission"), by Resolution #35/2002 allowed the application to deposit approximately 1000 cubic meters of fill to accommodate a septic field on the property noted above as proposed. This approval is granted provided that the development is in substantial compliance with the attached plan.

This letter represents the Commission's written approval for the project as required by Section 2(1)(a) of the Act. <u>THIS IS NOT A PERMIT</u>. Pursuant to Section 5 of the Act ("the City of Richmond") may now issue a soil placement permit (the "Permit") if it wishes to do so. Please note that the Commission's approval in no way compels the City of Richmond to issue a Permit. If a Permit is issued the City of Richmond may impose additional terms and conditions it considers necessary. If a Permit is issued, please forward a copy to this office.

Furthermore, this decision in no way relieves the owner or occupier of the responsibility of adhering to any other enactment, legislation or decision of any agency having jurisdiction.

The lands are still subject to the provisions of the Act, the Agricultural Land Reserve Act, and applicable regulations except as provided by this decision.




