STAFF REPORT

ORIGIN

In February 2001 General Purposes committee requested staff to report on the costs of facilitating a workshop for non-profit societies to deal with fund raising and other revenue generating proposals. Staff was also asked to review the financial contributions made by the Ministry of Children and Family and other ministries over the past year to the various non-profit groups. This report will deal with the above.

FINDINGS OF FACT

In 2001 there were 50 non- – profit groups applying for City of Richmond grants. Upon review of the agencies' application form and financial statements the following table was drafted. The table indicates the name of the agency, the grants they received from other sources and the amount.

The review indicates that a number of the agencies have established a number of avenues for funding while others have not gone out side the City of Richmond to request additional funds.

Many organizations presently enjoy a healthy financial picture but are coming to the realization that in the future they will be challenged with not only fund raising but also maintaining financial sustainability. All agencies are facing similar situations, in which guaranteed funding many not be readily available.

A few organizations are presently reviewing their financial picture and establishing strategies to improve their future. These organizations are looking at ways to generate revenue or decrease costs and subsequently decreasing dependence on government funding.

Those agencies not currently reviewing their long-term financial picture should be encouraged to do so. The City could assist this process for Richmond based non - profit organizations by hiring a financial consultant to discuss some possibilities for organizations to ensure a more sustainable financial future. Those individuals wishing to get into strategies specific to their organization could contract out the services of the consultant at a later point in time.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Should the City wish to contract the services of a financial management consultant the cost would be approximately \$800/day proposed that two sessions would be offered to accommodate a number of organizations.

CONCLUSION

Many of the City's Health, Social Services and Community groups come to the City for funding through the Grants program or the Casino program. These groups also go to other organizations or corporations for grants.

As governments and corporations are continually being challenged to maintain their own financial sustainability and to keep costs down, they may not be in a position to assist the non-profit organizations in future years.

In order to assist Richmond based non-profit organizations to plan for the future, the City may wish to hold an one/two day session with a financial consultant to set out a process for their organization. Those groups who are similar in nature may wish to team together or go independently and contract the services of this consultant at their expense to finalize various financial strategies.

The outcome of the individual sessions would be financial strategies, which could be implemented by each group to improve their financial sustainability.
