STAFF REPORT

ORIGIN

As per Richmond City Council direction at the May 13th, 1999 Special Council meeting, the following resolution was adopted:

"That staff review Bylaw No. 1988 and prepare amendments to the existing Bylaw to eliminate any redundant clauses and to modernize the Bylaw."

The attached draft Bylaw (Attachment 1) is in response to this resolution. Since May of 1999 staff have received feedback regarding proposed revisions to the existing Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw No. 1988. The proposed Bylaw No. 6959 has been developed including feedback and revisions from Council, the Council/Board Liaison Committee throughout 1999 and most recently at the School District No. 38 Facilities and Buildings Committee meeting on January 27, 2000.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

The existing Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw No. 1988 (Attachment 2) dates back 37 years to 1963. Through the development of the Municipal Code, changes to the Municipal Act of British Columbia and the "domino" effect of changes to other City of Richmond Bylaws, many issues have arisen in the past 37 years that have not been addressed in the Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw. The need therefore for repeal and modernization of the Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw became evident.

As inferred by the title "Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw," this bylaw affects properties owned solely and/or jointly by the City and School District No. 38. Attachment 3 is an included summary for information of the affected properties. Staff recommend that the proposed Bylaw No. 6959, while developed with School Board and School District No. 38 staff feedback, be brought to the School Board for review before being given first, second and third readings at Council.

Bylaw Summary and Highlights

Highlights of proposed Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw No. 6959 revisions include:

1.1 General Prohibitions

This section deals primarily with general regulations dealing with public safety, it ensures via Bylaw that the City and School District provide universal and community access for the community enjoyment of public parks and school grounds. This section and also provides an additional tool to deal with persons camping or "taking up a temporary abode overnight," a recurring issue in public stairwells, the dyke trail system and vacant public properties.

1.2 Motor Vehicles, Motorcycles and Bicycles

This section regulates the operation of vehicular traffic in and around public parks and school grounds, and is an additional tool in the prevention of damage to sports and playing fields, including the protection of Minoru track in particular.

1.3 Plants and Vegetation - Prohibitions / 1.4 Athletic and Recreational Facilities Prohibitions

These sections ensure that there is adequate protection for the natural and human environment contained within Richmond's Public Parks and School Grounds. Recurring damage to trees located in parks, incidents of arson in the parks and school grounds and prevention of damage to planted areas are included within these sections.

1.6 Animals - Prohibitions

Issues of animal control, specifically public safety regulations for dogs are addressed here.

Part TWO: Sections 2.1, 2.2

The grouping of these sections is a revision from Bylaw No. 1988 that collates generic activities (i.e. lighting barbeques, flying model airplanes etc). These activities are prohibited except in designated areas including the Model Airplane Park, or barbeque spots located in the parks system.

Part THREE: Prohibited Activities -Except with Written Authorization

- 3.1 These are designated activities whereby written permission or permit must be first obtained in the interest of minimizing potential conflict and/or threats to Public Safety in the Public Parks and School Grounds.
- This section is included to replace the reference to park closures that amended Bylaw No. 7033 at the July 26, 1999 meeting of City Council. As outlined in previous discussions, the park closure issue has been discussed at the joint City/District public meeting held in June 1999 and at the Council Board Committee throughout 1999.

As an additional tool for the RCMP, the park closure reference provides the RCMP with another means that complements the Criminal Code and Motor Vehicle Act in ensuring the safety and security of persons, neighbours and properties located in or adjacent to public parks and school grounds between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.

This section of the bylaw also is a means to prevent past incidents of vandalism and "partying" that occurred at Garry Point Park in particular. Since the inception of this bylaw, late night activity at Garry Point in particular has decreased.

PART FOUR: Temporary Activity Permits

This section designates officers as per the Municipal and School Acts of British Columbia who are authorized to provide exemptions to sections of the Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw in the performance of their duties.

Interpretation

This section has been included to clarify any language used in the body proper of the Bylaw. Redundant Clauses that have been eliminated from the old Bylaw No. 1988 from the year 1963 include:

- "Riding, herding and goats, sheep or swine"
- Miscellaneous traffic, vehicle and traffic control device regulations
- Disabled person parking regulations, including SPARC Disabled parking placard guidelines

These redundant clauses are currently addressed in other City of Richmond Bylaws.

Park/School Ground Signage

The existing Public Parks and School Ground Bylaw Signage (Attachment 4) reflect the content of Bylaw No. 1988. With proposed revisions to the Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw (6959) there will be a need for a phased process of replacing the existing park and school ground bylaw signage. Staff also recommend placing contact numbers on each park and school ground bylaw sign for the public to report acts of vandalism and/or request and receive information on Richmond's parks system as an improved level of customer service.

Enforcement

Pending approval of the Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw staff will prepare an amendment to the Municipal Ticket Information (MTI) Bylaw for the Chief Judge in Victoria to review and identify ticketable sections of the Bylaw and related fines.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Staff estimate the resource implications for replacing the existing outdated and ageing Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw No. 1988 signage to be approximately \$50,000. This amount would include the design, construction, installation hardware and removal of dated signage which can be phased over a number of years from the parks operations maintenance budget.

CONCLUSION

The proposed modernised version of the Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw No. 6959 includes many sections to assist with the enhancement and preservation of Richmond's public open spaces and parks for the future. Many of the proposed changes to the Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw reflect the consolidation of many changes in other City Bylaws and clarification of sections relating to environmental protection. Pending concurrence from the Staff and Board of School District 38, staff will prepare appropriate amendments to the MTI Bylaw to develop a process for ticketing and fines.

PUBLIC PARKS AND SCHOOL GROUNDS REGULATION BYLAW NO. 6959

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CITY OF RICHMOND

PUBLIC PARKS AND SCHOOL GROUNDS REGULATION BYLAW NO. 6959

The Council of the City of Richmond, in open meeting, enacts as follows:

PART ONE: OUTRIGHT PROHIBITIONS

1.1 General Prohibitions

- 1.1.1 A person must not:
 - (a) conduct himself or herself in a disorderly or offensive manner;
 - (b) obstruct the free use and enjoyment of any **public park** or **school ground** by any other person; or
 - (c) loiter to take up a temporary abode overnight

in any **public park** or **school ground**.

1.2 Vehicles and Bicycles - Prohibitions

- 1.2.1. A person must not:
 - (a) drive or operate any **vehicle** on any blacktop or gravelled or grassed area, except:
 - (i) for the purpose of parking in an authorized area; or
 - (ii) on business sanctioned by the **General Manager of Engineering and Public Works**, or the **General Manager of Community Services**, in the case of property under the jurisdiction of the **City**; or
 - (iii) on business sanctioned by the **Superintendent of Schools**, in the case of property under the jurisdiction of the **School District**, or
 - (b) **stop** or **park** or operate any **vehicle** on any grassed area other than in an authorized area

in any public park or school ground.

1.2.2. A person must not operate, ride or place a **vehicle** or bicycle on the Minoru running track located in Minoru Park.

1.3 Plants and Vegetation – Prohibitions

1.3.1. A person must not remove, harvest, pick or damage any plant life or vegetation, including trees, shrubs, flowers, fruit and vegetables in or from any public park or school ground.

1.4 Athletic and Recreational Facilities - Prohibitions

1.4.1. A person must not misuse, abuse, damage or interfere with any athletic or recreational facility or equipment in any **public park** or **school ground**.

1.5 Miscellaneous Prohibitions

1.5.1. A person must not launch any power rocket in any **public park** or **school ground**.

1.6 Animals - Prohibitions

- 1.6.1 A person must not molest, disturb, frighten, injure, trap or snare any bird, animal, or fish in any **public park** or **school ground**.
- 1.6.2 A person who owns an animal or has the care, custody or control of an animal, must:
 - (a) keep such animal from entering or remaining in any swimming pool, or wading pool or water park; and
 - (b) ensure that any animal under the control of such person does not molest, disturb, frighten, injure, trap or snare any bird, animal, or fish

located in a public park or school ground.

PART TWO: PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES - EXCEPT IN DESIGNATED AREAS

- 2.1 A person must not undertake any of the following activities in any **public park** or **school ground**, except in an area specifically designated for such activity:
 - (a) play or practice the game of golf, including the use of golf clubs for any purpose whatsoever;
 - (b) fly a gas model airplane;
 - (c) light any fire or barbeque;
 - (d) carry or discharge a **firearm**; or
 - (e) ride, herd or lead any horses or cattle.

2.2 A person must not, put any shot, or throw any hammer, discus, or javelin, except:

- (a) in an area within Minoru Park specifically designated for such activities; or
- (b) under the direct supervision of an employee designated by the **Superintendent** of Schools.

PART THREE: PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES – EXCEPT WITH WRITTEN AUTHORIZATION

3.1 Prohibited Activities Requiring Authorization

- 3.1.1 A person must not undertake any of the following activities in any public park or school ground, without first receiving written authorization under the provisions of Part Four:
 - (a) use a bow and arrow or practice archery;
 - (b) operate a go-kart;
 - (c) sell or expose for sale any refreshments or other articles or service; or
 - (d) fire or explode any combustible or other explosive material.

3.2 Hours of Public Park and School Ground Closures

- 3.2.1 A person must not enter or remain in any **public park** or **school ground** between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., where prohibited by sign, with the following exceptions:
 - (a) to attend a community facility during operating hours;
 - (b) the Richmond Skateboard Park;
 - (c) the No. 3 Road Pier;
 - (d) the No. 7 Road Pier Park:
 - (e) the No. 2 Road Pier at London's Landing Park;
 - (f) the Gilbert Beach;
 - (g) the Burnett/Thompson Community School/Park site;
 - (h) the Hamilton School/Park site; or
 - (i) as specified in a written authorization under the provisions of Part Four.

3.3 Special Authority to Close Public Parks and School Grounds

- 3.3.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3.1 or 3.2, either:
 - (a) the **General Manager**, **Engineering & Public Works**, or the **General Manager of Community Services**, in the case of property under the jurisdiction of the **City**; or
 - (b) the **Superintendent of Schools**, in the case of property under the jurisdiction of the **School District**,

may close any **public park** or **school ground** where the circumstances so warrant.

3.4 Exemptions

- 3.4.1 The provisions of Section 3.1 and 3.2 do not apply to:
 - (a) a **police officer**;
 - (b) the **General Manager, Engineering & Public Works**, or the **General Manager of Community Services**; or
 - (c) the Superintendent of Schools

in the performance of their duties.

PART FOUR: WRITTEN AUTHORIZATIONS

4.1 Procedure for Written Authorization

- 4.1.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of Part Three, any prohibited activities may be carried on within a **public park** or **school ground** if an applicant organization or person first receives written authorization for such activity from:
 - (a) the **General Manager of Community Services**; in the case of property under the jurisdiction of the **City**;
 - (b) the **Superintendent of Schools** in the case of property under the jurisdiction of the **School District**; or
 - (c) the **General Manager of Community Services**, together with the **Superintendent of Schools**, in the case of property under the joint jurisdiction of the **City** and the **School District**

whichever is applicable.

4.1.2 Every written authorization given in accordance with subsection 4.1.1 may contain restrictions as to the times and specific places where such activities may be carried on, together with any other restrictions considered appropriate.

PART FIVE: VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

- **5.1** Any person who:
 - (a) violates or who causes or allows any of the provisions of this bylaw to be violated; or
 - (b) fails to comply with any of the provisions of this bylaw; or
 - (c) neglects or refrains from doing anything required under this bylaw; or

(d) who permits any act or thing to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this bylaw;

is deemed to have committed an infraction of, or an offense against, this bylaw, and is liable on summary conviction, to the penalties provided for in the *Offence Act*, and each day that any such violation is caused or allowed to continue constitutes a separate offence.

PART SIX: INTERPRETATION

PARK

6.1 In this bylaw, the following words have the following meaning:

CITY means the City of Richmond.

COUNCIL means the Council of the **City** of Richmond.

FIREARM means a rifle, pistol, or shotgun and includes air

guns, air rifles, air pistols and spring guns but does not include firearms used for the discharge of blank ammunition in connection with an athletic or

sporting event.

GENERAL MANAGER OF means the person appointed by Council to the position of General Manager of Community Services, and

includes the person designated as an alternate.

GENERAL MANAGER OF means the person appointed by Council to the position of General Manager of Engineering & Public Works,

WORKS and includes the person designated as an alternate.

means the standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, other than up to 5 minutes for the purpose of, and while actually engaged in, loading or unloading of property, goods, or the discharging or taking on of passengers, or in compliance with the directions of:

(a) a **police officer**, a bylaw enforcement officer, or a person contracted by the **City** for traffic regulation purposes, or

(b) a traffic control device.

POLICE OFFICER means a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted

Police.

PUBLIC PARK/SCHOOL GROUND

means and includes public parks, playgrounds, paths, trails, beaches, swimming pools, arenas, community recreation centres, golf courses, sports and playing fields, buildings and other public places under the custody, care, management and jurisdiction of the **City**, and includes school grounds under the jurisdiction of the **School District**.

SCHOOL DISTRICT

means School District No. 38 (Richmond).

STOP

means:

- (a) when required, a complete cessation from movement, and
- (b) when prohibited, the stopping or standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer, a Bylaw Enforcement Officer or traffic-control device.

SUPERINTENDENT OF OF SCHOOLS

means the person appointed by the Board of School District No. 38 (Richmond) to the position of Superintendent of Schools, and includes the person designated as an alternate.

TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE

means a sign, line, meter, marking, space, barrier, or device; painted, placed or erected; to guide, regulate, warn, direct, restrict, control or prohibit **parking**.

VEHICLE

means the interpretation given in the *Motor Vehicle Act*, and includes motor vehicle and motorcycle, as defined in that *Act*.

PART SEVEN: PREVIOUS BYLAW REPEAL

7.1 Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw No. 1988 (adopted on August 19, 1963), and the following amendment bylaws are hereby repealed:

PART EIGHT: SEVERABILITY AND CITATION

8.1 The provisions of this bylaw are severable, and if, for any reason, any part, section, subsection, clause, or sub-clause, or other words in this bylaw are for any reason, found to be invalid or unenforceable by the decision of a Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision does not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this bylaw.

8.2 This bylaw is cited as "Public Parks and School Grounds Regulation Bylaw No. 6959".

BYLAW NO. 1988

EFFECTIVE DATE - AUGUST 19, 1963

CONSOLIDATED FOR CONVENIENCE ONLY

This is a consolidation of the bylaws below. The amendment bylaws have been combined with the original bylaw for convenience only. This consolidation is not a legal document. Certified copies of the original bylaws should be consulted for all interpretations and applications of the bylaws on this subject.

CITY OF RICHMOND

BYLAW NO. 1988

A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE USE OF PUBLIC PARKS AND SCHOOL GROUNDS WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY

The Council of the Corporation of the Township of Richmond, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

- 1. This bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the "Public Parks and School Grounds Bylaw".
- 2. No person shall, in any public park, place or school ground or on any public sidewalk or improved boulevard or on any other public planted area:
 - (a) ride, herd or lead any horse or herd or lead any cattle, sheep, goats or swine, nor
 - (b) play or practice the game of golf including the use of golf clubs for any purpose whatsoever, nor
 - (c) use a bow and arrow, nor
 - (d) fly a gas model airplane, nor
 - (e) operate "go kart", nor
 - (f) cause or allow the use of a vehicle including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, automobile, motorcycles and motor scooters, on any blacktop or gravelled area; except for the purpose of parking in an authorized parking zone, nor
 - (g) drive or operate a vehicle on any grassed area, nor
 - (h) stop or park a vehicle on any grassed area other than in an authorized parking zone.

Bylaw No. 3097

(i) remove, harvest, pick or damage any plant life or vegetation including trees, shrubs, flowers, fruit and vegetables,

Bylaw No. 3097

- (j) misuse, abuse, damage or interfere with any athletic or recreational facility, and without limiting the generality of the foregoing, no person shall operate, ride or place a motor vehicle, motorcycle, motor scooter or bicycle upon any running track or other athletic facility unless the facility displays a sign, authorized by Council, permitting such use.
- 3. The Council may by resolution cause traffic control devices not inconsistent with the "Motor Vehicle Act" to be placed or erected for the purpose of regulating, warning or guiding traffic.

BYLAW NO. 1988 PAGE 2

Bylaw No. 4123

(a) The council may, by resolution, cause traffic control devices of a design and type indicated by Schedule "B" to this Bylaw, to be erected indicating that certain designated parking spaces in any park or school ground shall be used as disabled persons parking.

4. A driver of a vehicle shall obey the instructions of an applicable traffic control device, except where otherwise directed by a Peace Officer.

Bylaw No. 4123

- (a) No person shall park any vehicle in a parking place designated as disabled persons parking unless the vehicle displays a sticker, decal or placard of a type shown in Schedule "A" hereto.
- 5. Notwithstanding anything in this Bylaw contained no person shall be prevented from playing golf, using a bow and arrow, driving a "go-kart", or flying a gas model airplane in an area designated for the purpose by the Council of The Corporation of the Township of Richmond by Bylaw or a resolution.

Bylaw No. 2395 & 2764

6. Everyone who owns an animal or has the care, custody or control of an animal shall keep such animal from entering or remaining in any swimming pool or wading pool located in a public park or any public place.

Bylaw No. 7033

- 7. No person shall enter or remain in any public park or school ground between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. with the following exceptions:
 - (a) if a community facility located in the public park or school ground is open to the public;
 - (b) Richmond Skate Board Park;
 - (c) No. 3 Road Pier;
 - (d) No. 7 Road Pier;
 - (e) No. 2 Road Pier;
 - (f) Burnett/Thompson Community School/ Park Site; and
 - (g) Hamilton School/Park Site.

Bylaw No. 7033

8. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 7, the General Manager of Urban Development, the General Manager of Community Services of the City of Richmond in conjunction with the Secretary-Treasurer of School District No. (38) may close any Public Park or School Ground when public health, safety or good order require.




9. Notwithstanding anything in this Bylaw contained, any or all of the uses or recreations restricted by section 2 of this Bylaw may be carried on within a park or school ground, upon the applicant organization or person obtaining a temporary permit from the Corporation of the Township of Richmond or the Board of School Trustees, School District No. 38 (Richmond), as the case may be. Every permit shall contain a restriction as to times and specific places where such uses or recreations may be carried on and such other provisions as are deemed necessary.

- 10. Any Justice of the Peace or other Court which convicts any person, pursuant to section 232 of the "Municipal Act", being Chapter 255 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1960, as amended, of an offence against this Bylaw, is hereby authorized to impose a fine or penalty not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) upon such person for each day or part of a day upon which such offence was committed; and any Justice of the Peace or other Court may, in default of payment of such fine or penalty, pursuant to section 232 of the said Act, commit an offender to imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty (30) days.
- 11. Bylaw No. 1870 and Bylaw No. 1893 be and the same are hereby repealed.

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
