STAFF REPORT

ORIGIN

The EcoWaste Industries, by letter dated, February 5, 1999, requests that its property on the east end of Williams Road be included in the Fraser Sewerage Area. The land is the site bounded by Blundell Road on the north, Williams Road on the south, Savage right-of-way on the west and No. 7 Road on the east.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The properties in question can be more accurately described as:

- 2. The boundary of the Fraser Sewerage Area abuts the EcoWaste Industries lands.
- 3. All of the properties listed in the above table are designated Business and Industry in the Official Community Plan.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

Only the Administration Board of the Greater Vancouver Sewerage & Drainage District (GVS&DD) has the authority to extend this Sewerage Area. The proposed extension has been reviewed by staff of the GVS&DD and was found to be technically acceptable. Sewage from the EcoWaste Industries development would be pumped to the Annacis Island Wastewater Treatment Plant.

EcoWaste Industries Ltd. in a letter dated February 5, 1999, (attached) has made a formal application for extension of the Sewerage Area to include its properties and it is the recommendation of this report that it be forwarded to the Administration Board of GVS&DD for consideration and adoption.

The GVS&DD sewerage system has sufficient capacity to allow the Fraser Sewerage area to be expanded to include all designated non-residential lands between the western boundary of the proposed EcoWaste Industries and the eastern boundary of the Lulu Island West Sewerage area. Staff are presently finalizing a servicing proposal from the Fraser River Harbour Commission (immediately east of EcoWaste) that, if approved, will see a trunk sewer extension to their boundary with EcoWaste.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

There will be no immediate impact on the City if the request is granted by the GVS&DD. The City could defer imposing its sewer levy on the subject lands until a development agreement has been made.

CONCLUSION

The proposed development is within the scope of the Official Community Plan.

The future development of the lands for EcoWaste Industries will necessitate the extension of the sanitary sewer system.

RE: INCLUSION OF ECOWASTE'S LAND IN SEWER CATCHMENT AREA

Ecowaste Industries Ltd., by this letter, formally requests that the City of Richmond initiate proceedings with the Greater Vancouver Regional District to have our Richmond property included with the sewer catchment area.

As you are aware, Ecowaste is part of a group of stakeholders in the East Richmond area whose lands are being considered for servicing and ultimately, for industrial development. While some of the group has been more active in the pursuit of development opportunities for their lands, Ecowaste's lands are not at this time being offered for development. Nevertheless, Ecowaste wishes to ensure that its lands are not precluded from such consideration.

Ecowaste's lands, consisting of approximately 400 acres (170 acres zoned industrial), are located on the western edge of the East Richmond lands being considered for future development, and the timing for the development of its lands is somewhat incumbent on the timing of the development to the east as well as the life span of the current activities on site. In our opinion, now is an appropriate time to start preparing the land for its future and ultimate use.

As you are aware, Ecowaste and its representatives have attended meetings chaired by your department with respect to servicing in East Richmond specifically for industrial development., and we appreciate the opportunity to participate in these discussions. Inclusion into the sewer catchment area is an initial and logical step given the direction evident from the meetings.
