#### **Staff Report**

#### Origin

Section 327 of the Local Government Act requires a municipality to adopt a 5 Year Financial Plan bylaw annually before May 15<sup>th</sup>. This bylaw includes the City's operating, utilities and capital budgets. The 5 Year Financial Plan bylaw provides Council with the authority to undertake expenditures, while the Statutory Reserve Fund Expenditure bylaws provide Council with the authority to access statutory reserves to fund capital projects approved under the 5 Year Financial Plan.

### **Analysis**

The 2002 Capital Budget totals \$32,072,818 of which \$29,825,819 is being funded through the Statutory Reserve Fund Expenditure Bylaws. The Child Care Development Reserve Fund Expenditure Bylaw #7346 was adopted on April 22, 2002 for \$28,602. The remaining 2002 Capital Budget funded by the Statutory Reserve Fund Expenditure Bylaws totalling \$29,797,217 are noted below.

The remaining 2002 Capital Budget which is non statutory in nature totals \$2,246,999 and is comprised of:

- 1. Funding from non-City sources \$1,312,500
- 2. Funding from other City Sources \$934,499.

### **Financial Impact**

The Bylaws listed below are required to provide the funding authorizations to finance various 2002 capital projects. The financing requirements are well within the existing reserve expenditure policies and funding availability. The total for each Bylaw is detailed below:

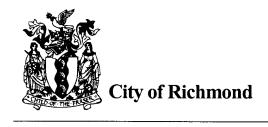
### Conclusion

- 1. The sum of \$2,000,000 is appropriated from the Affordable Housing Reserve Fund to finance capital works as approved in the 2002 Capital Budget.
- 2. The sum of \$8,210,656 is appropriated from the Capital Reserve Fund to finance the following projects as set out in Schedule A and as approved in the 2002 Capital Budget.
- 3. The sum of \$650,0000 is appropriated from the Capital Building and Infrastructure Reserve Fund to finance the Artificial Sports Turf Field Project as approved in the 2002 Capital Budget.
- 4. The sum of \$21,398 is appropriated from the Child Care Development Reserve Fund to finance capital works as approved in the 2002 Capital Budget.
- 5. The sum of \$3,164,000 is appropriated from the Equipment Replacement Reserve Fund to finance the following projects as approved in the 2002 Capital Budget:

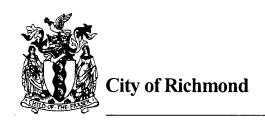

- 6. The sum of \$620,0000 is appropriated from the Steveston Road Ends Reserve Fund to finance the Waterfront Improvement Program as approved in the 2002 Capital Budget.
- 7. Should any of the above amounts remain unexpended after the authorized expenditures have been made, such balances must be returned to the credit of the applicable reserve funds.
- 8. This bylaw is cited as "Reserve Fund Expenditure Bylaw No. 7376".

- 3. This bylaw is cited as "Development Cost Charges Reserve Fund Expenditure Bylaw No. 7377".

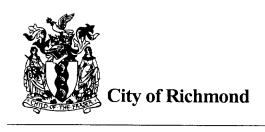

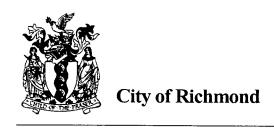
