STAFF REPORT

ORIGIN

Tom Krish starts his employment with the City of Richmond as Bylaw Enforcement Officer, for the purposes of bylaw enforcement, on May 21, 2002.

ANALYSIS

Under the provisions of the Offence Act, for the purposes of the issuance of a violation ticket, and/or service of summons in respect of an alleged offence under a bylaw of a Municipality, a Peace Officer includes a Bylaw Enforcement Officer as appoint under the Police Act.

In order for the Bylaw Enforcement Officer to carry out his/her function, it is necessary for Council to give formal authorisation to the individual concerned.

In addition, a number of municipal bylaws listed in the Municipal Ticket Information Authorisation Bylaw No. 7139 are meant to be enforced by a Bylaw Enforcement Officer by means of a ticket system. For the purposes of ticket issuance, the Officer must also be authorised for this function.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

CONCLUSION

It is recommended that Council authorise the appointment of Tom Krish as a Bylaw Enforcement Officer in accordance with Section 36 of the Police Act, for the purposes of the service of a summons and the issuing of tickets under the authority of Bylaw No. 7139
