STAFF REPORT

<u>ORIGIN</u>

A letter of application has been received from the Steveston Community Society requesting permission to conduct the *55th Annual Steveston Salmon Festival Parade* in the Steveston area. The parade will commence at 10:00 a.m., on Canada Day, Saturday, July 1, 2000.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

Following discussions with the Steveston Business Association and the Steveston Historical Society, the parade route remains as established in 1990 (Attachment 1). The parade route is described as follows:

<u>Assembly:</u> On No. 1 Road, north of Steveston Highway and on Steveston Highway, west of No.1 Road.

<u>Parade Route:</u> The parade will proceed south on No. 1 Road to Chatham Street, west to Third Avenue, south to Moncton Street, east to Railway Avenue and dispersal.

The parade route has continued to be popular since being established in 1990.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The cost to provide temporary traffic control signing and barricading for the parade is estimated to be \$1,500. Off-duty RCMP Officers will provide intersection control point duty and parade escort at overtime rates at an estimated cost of \$2,000.

The funding source for this event is the Special Events Account 4426-10-241-24100 (Steveston Salmon Festival).

CONCLUSION

The Steveston Salmon Festival Parade route has proven successful over the years and continues to be supported by the residents and business community in Steveston.
