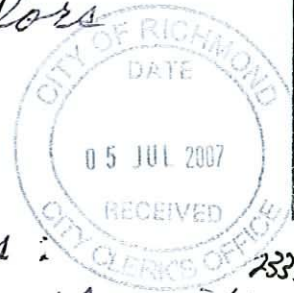

I would like to address the city council on the issue of trees near my home on Monday, July 9. I live in the 5000 Block on No. 1 Road.

On the west side of the boulevard the city cuts the grass. Why doesn't the city cut the grass on the east side?

I complained about two years ago about hitting my head on the trees on the east side of the road. I think the gardeners who cut the grass on the west side should trim the trees. I am still hitting my head on the east side of the street.

The trees ^{and bushes} at the following houses on No. 1 Rd. need to be trimmed.

5760 The bush is eighteen inches over the sidewalk.

5900 The grass is twelve inches high

4051 Westminster Hwy. The bush is on the street.

On the west side of No. 1 Rd. next to Church's Chicken I hit my head on the trees.

At the first house on the south side on the west side the bush is hanging over from the back yard.

The city inspector said I have to trim the shrubbery on the sidewalk in front of my place. The city should cut the shrubbery because it is on city property. The city should not have bushes or trees growing under hydro lines. There are trees of about ten inches in diameter under the hydro lines in front of my home.
