ORIGIN

Purpose

This report is a response to the following Planning Committee referral resolution which was passed on June 6th, 2000:

"That the following question,

"The view of each Nominating Entity on whether it recommends any further supplements to the Authority's consultations on its draft land management policy",

be referred to staff for comment and report to Council, through the Planning Committee, and that this report indicate that Council declines to comment on the second matter,

"The view of each Nominating Entity on whether it supports, opposes, or declines to comment upon, the substance of the Authority's draft land management policy".

FINDINGS OF FACT

Richmond City Council is concerned that the current YVR public and stakeholder consultation process for its draft land management policy may not have:

- been sufficiently clear to all those affected, and
- provided the fullest forum for the community and partners to become fully informed and to fully express their concerns, ideas and interests.

ANALYSIS

The main concern is that Council does not know how the interests of the overall community will be affected and addressed by the YVR's draft land management policy.

As a result, it appears desirable for the YVR to conduct additional consultations with the public and stakeholders to ensure that the YVR land management policy will be effective.

The City is prepared to assist the YVR in supplementing its consultations process, if requested.
