RICHMOND RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNERS GROUP

RRDOG'S THREE PILLAR APPROACH TO DOG MANAGEMENT STRATEGY FOR RICHMOND

The following is a framework for the information developed and proposed to City of Richmond Staff in May 2007 as part of RRDOG's consultative process with the City. The Three Pillar Approach concentrates on Environment, Education, and Enforcement.

RRDOG encouraged the City of Richmond to meet its obligations to the community by adopting a Three Pillar Approach and providing adequate investments in those pillars. While all three pillars are essential to a successful dog management strategy, adequate leadership and investment in the Education and Environment pillars should lead to a reduced need for investment in the Enforcement pillar.

Education

- Public awareness
 - Media articles and brochures
- Training
 - Facilities
 - Programs
- Compliance
 - Reasonable and realistic by-laws
 - Public buy-in

Enforcement

- Reasonable and Realistic bylaws
- Sufficient and efficient enforcement officers
- Costs of enforcement will be inversely proportional to investments in Education and Environment

Environment

- > Facilities
 - Parks
 - · MOPS: Multiple Use Off Leash Parks
 - DOPS: Dedicated Off Leash Parks
 - ROMPS: Enclosed runs for untrained dogs
- time allocations

- > Health
 - Sanitation biodegradable disposal bags
 - Composting of waste
- Public Safety will be directly proportional to investments in Education and Environment

RICHMOND RESPONSIBLE DOG OWNERS GROUP RRDOG Mission Statement

RRDOG is a registered, non-profit. volunteer, democratic, multi-cultural advocacy group of Richmond residents and dog-related business operators dedicated to making our communities friendlier, safer, and environmentally better for everyone by proactively addressing dog issues.

RRDOG membership crosses all demographic, age, gender and ethnic boundaries. RRDOG is inclusive, not exclusive. Membership is not restricted to dog handlers, owners and guardians. It is open to anyone who wants to make Richmond a better place by joining us in our mission and having fun doing it.

RRDOG Philosophy and Factoids

- RRDOG was established in September of 2005.
- RRDOG promotes a culture of compliance with principles of responsible dog handling, obedience and etiquette protocols.
- RRDOG advocates for education, adequate facilities, fair laws, and enforcement with discretion in the context of the whole community. Unless everyone wins, no one really wins.
- RRDOG has approximately fifty members and supporters. Each contributes according to their individual ability. For some this is simply being a member and adding to our political strength. For the most active, it has become a major commitment. There is a place for everyone.
- RRDOG's core group is extremely dedicated, with impressive skill sets in a wide variety of fields.
- RRDOG has monthly membership meetings, except July and August, on the fourth Wednesday of the month, usually at Cambie Community Centre, a dog friendly venue
- RRDOG has frequent impromptu, committee, telephone and social meetings.
- RRDOG communicates with members by email, telephone, fax and media announcements.
- RRDOG consults with the City of Richmond through our elected City Councillors: and Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Services Staff CityDog Liaison.
- RRDOG is funded by a combination of membership fees, member contributions, corporate donors and supporters, fundraising activities, the sale of RRDOG logo gear and a municipal grant.
- RRDOG elects directors and officers at our annual general meeting in October. As our community, political, financial, educational, environmental and social activities have increased, our Board of Directors has increased.
- RRDOG subscribes to a casual democratic model. We are goal and fun oriented.
- RRDOG has developed several unique initiatives to make Richmond a template for dog friendly communities that other municipalities will emulate. We are already ahead of the curve.
- RRDOG recognizes the enhanced quality of life dogs bring to a community in social, safety and health benefits.

RRDOG Initiatives:

CityDog

- RRDOG gives dog handlers, owners and guardians a voice in the City Richmond through CityDog Liaison.
- RRDOG 7-C's PowerPoint Presentation to City Council: Communication, Consultation, Compromise, Cooperation, Collaboration, Culture of Compliance and Cost Effectiveness provides a framework, and is on both the City of Richmond and RRDOG websites.
- RRDOG's Three Pillar Approach to Dog Management: Education, Environment and Enforcement was submitted to City Staff through our CityDog Liaison.
- RRDOG advocates for adequate facilities in return for our tax and licensing revenue:
 - MOPS, multiple use off-leash privilege public parks
 - DOPS, dedicated off-leash parks
 - ROMPS, enclosed play areas for safely socializing untrained dogs and puppies
- RRDOG advocates for fair animal control bylaws and enforcement with discretion.
- RRDOG's and the City of Richmond's relationship has evolved into one based on the 7-C's as a result of the leadership of City Councillors who recognize the benefits which RRDOG can contribute.

DogWatch

- RRDOG encourages a canine culture of compliance with socially acceptable standards of obedience, etiquette and dog handling.
- RRDOG influences dog handlers, owners and guardians by being politely persuasive and respectfully instructive.
- RRDOG members will observe, record, report and witness to City Bylaw Enforcement and the RCMP if necessary, to achieve compliance by those who give us all a bad reputation. Targeted enforcement will increase effectiveness and save tax dollars.
- RRDOG supports Bylaw Enforcement, RCMP, Blockwatch, Richmond Animal Protection Society (RAPS), and the SPCA in our common goals.
- RRDOG works with individual schools to address the problems dogs create on school grounds.
- RRDOG promotes its agenda though frequent media articles like the Richmond News' Pet Page, which was itself an RRDOG initiative. its website, surveys, the City hosted Animal Wellness Expo. distribution of brochures via dog related businesses and community centers, and its public presence.

DogEduc

- RRDOG is working with the City of Richmond to promote affordable obedience and etiquette education in community centres.
- RRDOG Master Dog Trainer provides discounts to members, free tips at meetings and advice on behavioural problems.
- RRDOG Associate Veterinarian provides health care information and free seminars to to members.
- Guest speakers on a variety of dog-related topics are invited to meetings.
- RRDOG members write articles on RRDOG initiatives, including training issues, for The Richmond News Pet Page.
- RRDOG promotes Good Canine Citizen Certification for all dog handlers, owners and guardians.

Disability Dog

- RRDOG advocates for Bylaw exemptions for disabled dog owners with obedience trained dogs.
- RRDOG assists disabled RRDOG members. We understand not all disabilities are visible.
- RRDOG recognizes and encourages the substantial health benefits dogs bring to everyone, especially persons with challenging disabilities.

EnviroDog

- RRDOG encourages all DogHogs (handlers, owners, guardians) to bag, pick up, stoop n' scoop and "do the doo" so our environment is cleaner for everyone. Be a GOOD DogHog!
- RRDOG members, including our commercial dog walker members, conduct both
 daily and group event poop patrols to clean up the waste irresponsible BAD DogHogs
 leave behind in public parks and school grounds.
- RRDOG advocates for the use of biodegradable poop bags by City Dog Bag Dispenser Sponsors and individuals.
- RRDOG promotes both backyard and City Parks dog waste composting. With approximately 12,000 dogs in Richmond producing more than 700 metric tonnes of poop, trucking it to a landfill is environmentally irresponsible and a waste of tax dollars.
- RRDOG encourages, supports, patronizes and applauds corporate sponsors of City of Richmond Dog Bag Dispenser and Adopt-a-Park initiatives. We also "doo" our part with poop patrols.
