Staff Report

Last month, Council amended both the Traffic Bylaw and the Parking (Off-Street) Bylaw to accommodate Parking Permit areas and Metered Parking areas. In the course of those amendments, Council also changed, from 34 days to 14 days, the period stipulated in the latter bylaw, during which the violator may pay a lesser fine amount. Unfortunately, there is a corresponding provision in the Traffic Bylaw which was not amended at that time. It would be appropriate to re-instate a consistent (now 14 days) period for both parking off-street and parking on-street fine payments, not only because of the common computer system in which the City records this information, but also to eliminate any public confusion. Bylaw No. 7420 accomplishes this.

TRAFFIC BYLAW NO. 5870, AMENDMENT BYLAW NO. 7420

The Council of the City of Richmond enacts as follows:

- 1. Bylaw No. 5870 is amended by deleting "34 days" from clauses (a) and (b) in the Fines section in each of Level II, Level II, and Level III, in Schedule I and by substituting "14 days" in each case.
- 2. This Bylaw is cited as "Traffic Bylaw No. 5870, Amendment Bylaw No. 7420".
