## **Staff Report**

### **Origin**

Staff have received an application for the establishment of a video arcade (amusement centre at unit 2250 – 8181 Cambie Road. ( 11 machines.)

Video arcades are currently restricted to locations specified in schedule A of the Business Regulation Bylaw 7538. The proposed unit is not identified in the Bylaw.

### **Analysis**

The subject property is currently zoned Comprehensive Development District (CD/1), a classification which permits, among other uses, commercial entertainment.

Video arcades fall within the ambit of commercial entertainment.

Until recently, the “conventional” arcade has used standard amusement machines for playing games, and the City has imposed strict operating hours within which arcades would be permitted to operate.

Over the last several months businesses have opened up as “Internet Cafes”, where a coffee shop operates, complete with computers for customers to go on the internet for a fee, while having coffee and snacks.

However, site visits by staff identified that the establishments are in fact operating game playing amusement machines for a fee.

By operating on the pretext of an “internet café”, these establishments felt that they could operate without any hours of operation restrictions or any need to adhere to the Amusement Centre regulations in the Business Regulation Bylaw.

Staff have taken the position that they are indeed arcades, and that they would require council approval to operate. This report is for a new location which has made application to the City be considered a Video Arcade and to comply with all the requirements in the Business Regulation Bylaw.

### **Financial Impact**

Nil.

### **Conclusion**

The concept of the “Internet Café” has taken off, and is growing in popularity, as the previous approved locations, and this new request can attest, and is expected to continue.

Staff feel that such establishments should be regulated in the same manner as the conventional arcades to create a level playing field and to control the hours of operation, and can offer no

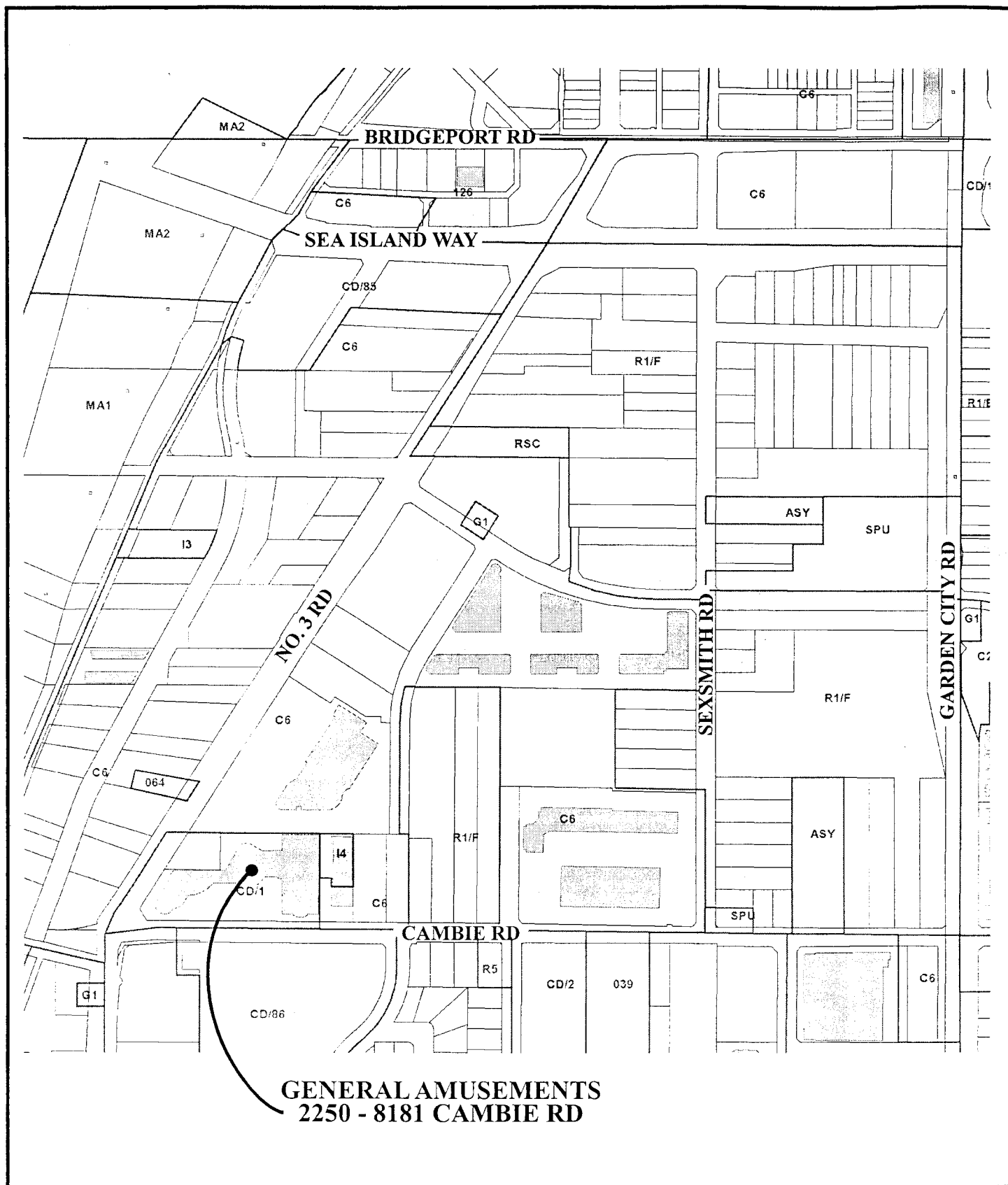
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reason why the application presented to operate a video arcade should not be favourably considered.
