Staff Report

Origin

Curt Toews started his employment with the City of Richmond as Supervisor, Parking Program for the purposes of bylaw enforcement on September 12, 2005.

Analysis

It would be appropriate to provide the new Supervisor, Parking Program the ability to issue both Municipal Ticket Information and Parking Bylaw Violations.

Under provisions of the Offence Act, for the purposes of the issuance of a violation ticket and / or service of summons in respect of an alleged offence under a bylaw of a Municipality, a Peace Officer includes Bylaw Enforcement Officers as appointed under the Police Act.

Conclusion

It is recommended that Council authorize the appointment of Curt Toews as a Bylaw Enforcement Officer in accordance with Section 36 of the Police Act, for the purposes of the service of a summons and the issuance of tickets under the authority of Bylaw No. 7321.
