


Staff Recommendation

Origin

Michael Nivens started his temporary full time employment with the City of Richmond as a Parking Patroller for the purposes of bylaw enforcement, on October 19, 2004. The Officer will be trained, equipped, and commence enforcement duties upon completion of training.

By appointing a Bylaw Enforcement Officer under the Police Act, it allows the Officer to serve summons for alleged offences under a Municipal Bylaw.
