WORLD EXPOSITION IN AICHI, JAPAN

The General Purposes Committee, at its meeting held on Monday, October 18th, 2004, considered the attached material, and recommends as follows:

Committee Recommendation (Mayor Brodie, Cllrs. Barnes and E. Halsey-Brandt opposed)

- That Richmond City Council confirm its approval in principle to send a delegation to (1) the 2005 World Exposition to be held in Aichi, Japan, at a cost not to exceed \$40,000, with staff time defined prior to final approval; and
- That staff report to the General Purposes Committee as soon as possible on the amount (2) of staff time which would be required.

According to our policy and mandate, our committee would like to request council's approval of a trip to Japan in May of 2005.

The Government of Canada has recognized our sister city relationship with Wakayama Japan as one of the 15 most active relationships in Canada. As a result we have had an invitation to participate in the Canadian Pavilion of Expo 2005 in Aichi Japan being held March to September 2005.



He explained that the Canadian Pavilion intends to tell our story with 3 objectives.

- 3. Support ongoing trade and political relations

Our committee was offered the special opportunity to plan a Richmond Day at the Canadian Pavilion of Expo in order to strengthen our sister city relations.
