Bylaws for Adoption – Business Regulation Amendment Bylaw No. 7048 and Business Licence Amendment Bylaw No. 7049

Mr. Chris Van Twest, Solicitor, #405 – 1160 Burrard Street, Vancouver, addressed a number of issues contained in the two bylaws, and requested a deferral of their adoption. As an alternative, he urged the Mayor to exercise his prerogative under Section 219 of the Municipal Act and return the two bylaws in question to staff for further review. A copy of his submission is on file in the City Clerk's Office.

Mr. Habib Samari, the owner and operator of Oscar Billiards at No. 4 Road and Steveston Highway, provided information on the steps which he had taken to ensure that (i) the pool hall which he owned was located within the appropriate zone, (ii) the operation complied with all City regulations, and at the same time, (iii) a safe facility was provided for the patrons. A copy of the material circulated by Mr. Samari, including a petition signed by approximately 240 individuals who supported the continued operation of this facility, is on file in the City Clerk's Office

Mr. Ian Rowes, of 4133 Cavendish Drive, stated that Oscar Billiards was the cleanest and safest pool hall operation which he had frequented. He urged Council to take no action to require this particular pool hall to close at 11:00 p.m.

 - (d) to request the Minister to take responsibility on behalf of local governments, for this disregard of federal and provincial constitutional protocol by the First Nations Gaming Association;



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- (e) to request the Minister to take the initiative to prohibit any construction activity on Indian Reserve No. 3 on Sea Island until the jurisdiction over gaming is resolved; and
- (f) to advise the Minister of the health issues relating to the disposal of sewage from the casino facility, and safety concerns with respect to the movement of aircraft in the area of the north runway at the Vancouver International Airport Authority.
- (2) That the Mayor, on behalf of Council, write to the Honourable Raymond Chan to inform him of the casino proposal for an appropriate response under the Fisheries Act, and for his response on the jurisdiction issue through the Federal Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development, the Honourable Robert Nault.
- (3) That correspondence be sent to the Federal Ministry of Environment and to the Vancouver International Airport Local Authority to apprise these two agencies of the situation with regard to the proposed casino.
- (4) That copies of the correspondence be provided to the Honourable Joan Smallwood, Minister of Labour, the Lower Mainland Treaty Advisory Committee and the Greater Vancouver Regional District.
