Staff Report

Origin

At the March 26, 2007 meeting, Council adopted the "Enforcement of Grease Discharges to City Sewers" report, which included several recommendations related to discharge of grease into City sewers including the following specific recommendation.

b) Amend Municipal Ticket Information (MTI) Authorization Bylaw 7321 to specifically identify a fine associated with a violation of a bylaw requirement to dispose of grease other than into a sewer system;

The purpose of this report is to recommend that Council adopt the proposed Municipal Ticket Information (MTI) Authorization Amendment Bylaw 8301 (Attachment 1) which defines the ticketing process associated with disposal of grease into the City's sewer system.

Analysis

Grease impacting the City's sanitary sewer system is thought to be largely derived from preparation of food products. There is considerable field evidence that suggests that the grease is disposed of in the sanitary sewer system particularly in the vicinity of restaurants.

The annual cost to the City and to Metro Vancouver is estimated to be \$311,000 and between \$40,000 to \$50,000 respectively. Accumulations of grease in the sanitary sewer system impact the sewer system capacity, and also increase the incidences of blockages and the likelihood of sewer overflows resulting in an increased risk to public health.

The proposed MTI amendment Bylaw 8301 provides for a graduated fine system based on a progression of \$100, \$500 and \$1,000 fines for the first, second and third offences. MTI fines may be imposed as an alternative to prosecuting under the Offence Act, which is retained through Drainage, Dyke and Sanitary Sewer System Amendment Bylaw 8284.

The proposed MTI Amendment Bylaw 8301 is one of several steps being taken by the City to substantially reduce/eliminate grease discharges into City sewers. Other initiatives underway include:

- A strategy has been developed for a part time enforcement officer who will have an anticipated start date of March 2008.
- A communication plan has been developed which includes numerous public and restaurant specific communications as well as regular updates to Council. Roll-out of this program is planned to commence in January 2008.
- A review on the feasibility of including a grease disposal point at the City's recycling centre is being investigated. A report to Council will be forthcoming in this regard.

The above measures create the potential to realize the sustainable practice of collecting grease at the source before it is contaminated and converting it into bio-diesel fuel should the opportunity arise in this growing area of interest.

Financial Impact

It is anticipated there will be revenue associated with fines levied through issuing of tickets. As this is a new process, it is not possible to quantify the anticipated revenue at this time.

The cost associated with a bylaw enforcement officer and the respective vehicle was previously presented to Council and was included as part of the 2008 Sanitary Utility budget.

Conclusion

At the March 26, 2007 meeting, Council directed staff to amend MTl Bylaw 7321 to include a fine associated with discharge of grease into City sewers. Amendment Bylaw 8301 has been prepared for Council consideration in this regard and includes a graduated system of fines. It is intended that by pursuing this program that discharge of grease into the City's sewer system will discontinue.
