Staff Report

Origin

As part of Polygon's Westbury Lane development proposal at 7611 – 7771 No. 4 Road, the developer proposes to donate a public art project to the City. This report presents for Council's consideration the proposed public art project, artist and location.

Findings Of Fact

Development Proposal

The Polygon Westbury Lane development consists of 42 townhouse units. Council approved the residential development's rezoning application (RZ 04-276421) on May 24, 2005 and the development permit (DP 04-280617) on June 13, 2005. As part of the rezoning and development permit, Polygon agreed to integrate a public art project on the development's site or vicinity.

Public Art Project

Artist David Anderson titles the proposed public art sculpture "The Digging Figure" (**Attachment 1**). The dimensions of the sculpture will be 5 ½ feet high on a 1-foot high circular plinth (pedestal) that is 5 ½ feet in diameter. The weight of the sculpture will be no more than 1,500 lbs and the concrete plinth weighs about 2,500 lbs. The work is a ¾ life size sculpture of a digging man, to be cast in a pigmented, glass reinforced concrete.

Public Art Theme

The artwork celebrates the contribution of agriculture and those who worked in the industry, and their contribution toward building a vibrant City.

Artist David Anderson's credentials are presented as **Attachment 2**.

Located on City-Land

The proposed location of the artwork is on City owned boulevard space along Keefer Street, just immediately in front of the Westbury Land development (Attachment 3).

Both Transportation and Engineering staff have reviewed the proposed location in terms of pedestrian safety and vehicular visibility, and have no concerns. The artwork will be designed so that it can easily be moved and returned to its location by City street crews, if future utility or street work is required.

Value of Public Art Project

The estimated value of the artwork donation is \$38,000.

Next Steps

- ☐ If approved, the developer, City and artist will coordinated the public art installation.
- ☐ If approved, the developer will transfer ownership of the work to the City.
- ☐ It is anticipated that the public art project will be installed by late 2006 or early 2007.

Analysis

Kevin Shoemaker, Vice President of Development for Polygon Homes, Chris Kay, Assistant Development Manager of Polygon Homes, and David Robinson, sculptor, attended and unveiled a clay maquette artwork at the September 28th, 2005 Public Art Commission meeting. The maquette of the proposed artwork will be presented at the Committee.

The Public Art Commission was very impressed with the proposed artwork, the artistic interpretation, and merit, as well as the distinguished and celebrated artist David Robinson.

Financial Impact

The artwork will require minimal periodic power washing, and security monitoring by the City at an approximate annual cost of \$200 per time every two or three years. City funds would be allocated out of the City's annual operating budget.

Conclusion

The proposed sculpture "The Digging Figure" by artist David Anderson represents a significant gift, one that will promote and honour Richmond's agricultural past, and commemorates the contribution of the farmers to a vibrant City.
