ORIGIN

Christopher Hurrell starts his employment with the City of Richmond as Parking Patroller, for the purposes of bylaw enforcement, on Monday, November 27, 2000.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

Under the provisions of the Offence Act, for the purposes of the service of a summons in respect of an alleged offence under a bylaw of a Municipality, a Peace Officer includes Bylaw Enforcement Officers appointed under the Police Act.

In addition, among the bylaws listed in Municipal Ticket Information Authorisation Bylaw No. 7139, to be enforced by means of the ticket system is the Bylaw to provide for the Licencing of Commercial Vehicles. Schedule A of Bylaw No. 7139 lists Parking Patrollers as designated Bylaw Enforcement Officers, for the purposes of ticket service. In order for Parking Patrollers to carry out this function, it will be necessary for Council to give formal authorisation to the individual concerned.
