Staff Report

Origin

The Richmond Agricultural Advisory Committee (AAC) was established in 2003 upon completion of the Agricultural Viability Strategy (AVS). A primary role of the AAC is to provide advice from an agricultural perspective to Council, City staff and other stakeholders on a range of issues and projects that impact agricultural activities in Richmond. The AAC also helps to assist in the implementation of recommendations contained in the Agricultural Viability Strategy, which was approved by Council on May 26, 2003.

This report summarizes the activities of the AAC in 2008 and proposes a 2009 work plan for Council consideration and approval.

These proactive initiatives will help to inform agricultural stakeholders of forthcoming works and enable comments and feedback to be given where appropriate.
