WHILE WE ARE OPPOSED TO THE BANNING OF THE SALE OF BOTTLED WATER IN ANY MUNICIPAL FACILITY WHERE THERE IS REGULAR PUBLIC ACCESS, WE BELIEVE THE CITY OF RICHMOND REPORT TAKES A BALANCED APPROACH...

GIVEN THE CURRENT UNCERTAIN ECONOMIC ENVIRONMENT THAT EXISTS ACROSS THE PROVINCE, WE BELIEVE A BAN WOULD IMPACT THE CURRENT EMPLOYMENT OUTLOOK FOR OUR INDUSTRY AS WELL AS FUTURE JOB CREATION, ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP AND INDUSTRY INVESTMENT PROSPECTS...

WHILE WE ARE OPPOSED TO ANY INITIATIVE
THAT RESULTS IN THE BANNING OF THE SALE
OF BOTTLED WATER, WE ARE NOT OPPOSED
TO MUNICIPAL COUNCILS REPLACING
BOTTLED WATER WITH PITCHERS OF TAP
WATER AT COUNCIL OR COMMITTEE

THIS CONCERN HAS BEEN EXPRESSED BY A NUMBER OF PUBLIC HEALTH UNITS ACROSS CANADA, INCLUDING MIDDLESEX-LONDON HEALTH UNIT DIRECTOR JAMES REFFLE, WHO WROTE THAT "WE DO HAVE CONCERNS ABOUT THE POSSIBLE UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES OF REMOVING THE SALE OF **BOTTLED WATER IN CITY-OPERATED** FACILITIES WHERE OTHER NUTRITIONALLY-DEFICIENT BOTTLED DRINKS CAN REMAIN TO BE OFFERED FOR SALE. IF BOTTLED WATER IS NOT AVAILABLE, AND ACCESS TO MUNICIPAL DRINKING WATER FOUNTAINS IS LIMITED, THEN THE PUBLIC MAY OPT FOR DRINKS WITH HIGHER LEVELS OF SUGAR, NO NUTRITIVE VALUE AND HIGH ACID CONTENT..."
