### **Staff Report**

## Origin

Richmond and Vancouver, the original parties to an agreement with E-Comm, have been asked by E-Comm to sign an addendum to the existing 2005 Fire Records Management System agreement. The addendum allows for the inclusion of additional cities and minor, but important, modifications to the governance and operational model.

Council authorization is requested to allow the Chief Administrative Officer and the General Manager of Law & Community Safety to execute the addendum agreement on behalf of the City.

## **Findings Of Fact**

In 2005, the City of Richmond entered into a service agreement with E-Comm for the provision of a Fire Records Management System (RMS) along with the City of Vancouver.

The cities of New Westminster, Delta, and Port Moody are existing E-Comm clients that have recently joined the RMS. Coquitlam is a new E-Comm client that also has access to the RMS. The addendum agreement would allow cities to participate in the RMS, who are not Class A or B shareholders of E-Comm. Richmond and Vancouver are both Class A shareholders who participate in E-Comm's fire records, computer automated dispatch programs, and use their equipment.

The governance in the original agreement is being modified to change the authority for the ongoing management and operation of the RMS from the "Fire Services Committee" to the "Management Committee". The Management Committee will be comprised of only Fire Department representatives who are RMS participants, which differs from the current Fire Services Committee. Richmond continues to play a strong leadership role in the development of the Fire RMS with its current Fire Chief serving as the past and present Fire Services Committee and Management Committee Chair.

Richmond's Fire Chief continues to promote and encourage other cities to join the RMS project which decreases Richmond's costs. The need for each City to execute addendum agreements to add new cities into the RMS agreement in the future will not be required as it has been addressed in the proposed addendum.

#### **Financial Analysis**

Richmond has realized financial benefits of approximately \$50,000 in a reduction of their E-Comm levies due to the inclusion of new cities into the Fire RMS.

#### Financial Impact

None.

## Conclusion

The proposed changes to the Fire RMS Agreement are positive and create a fair and appropriate framework with which future cities can participate in the Fire RMS project at E-Comm.
