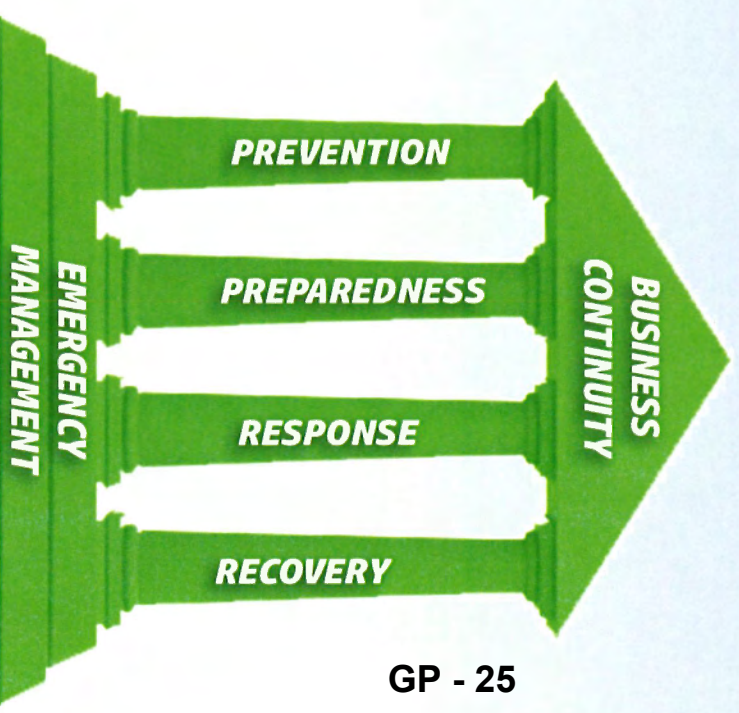

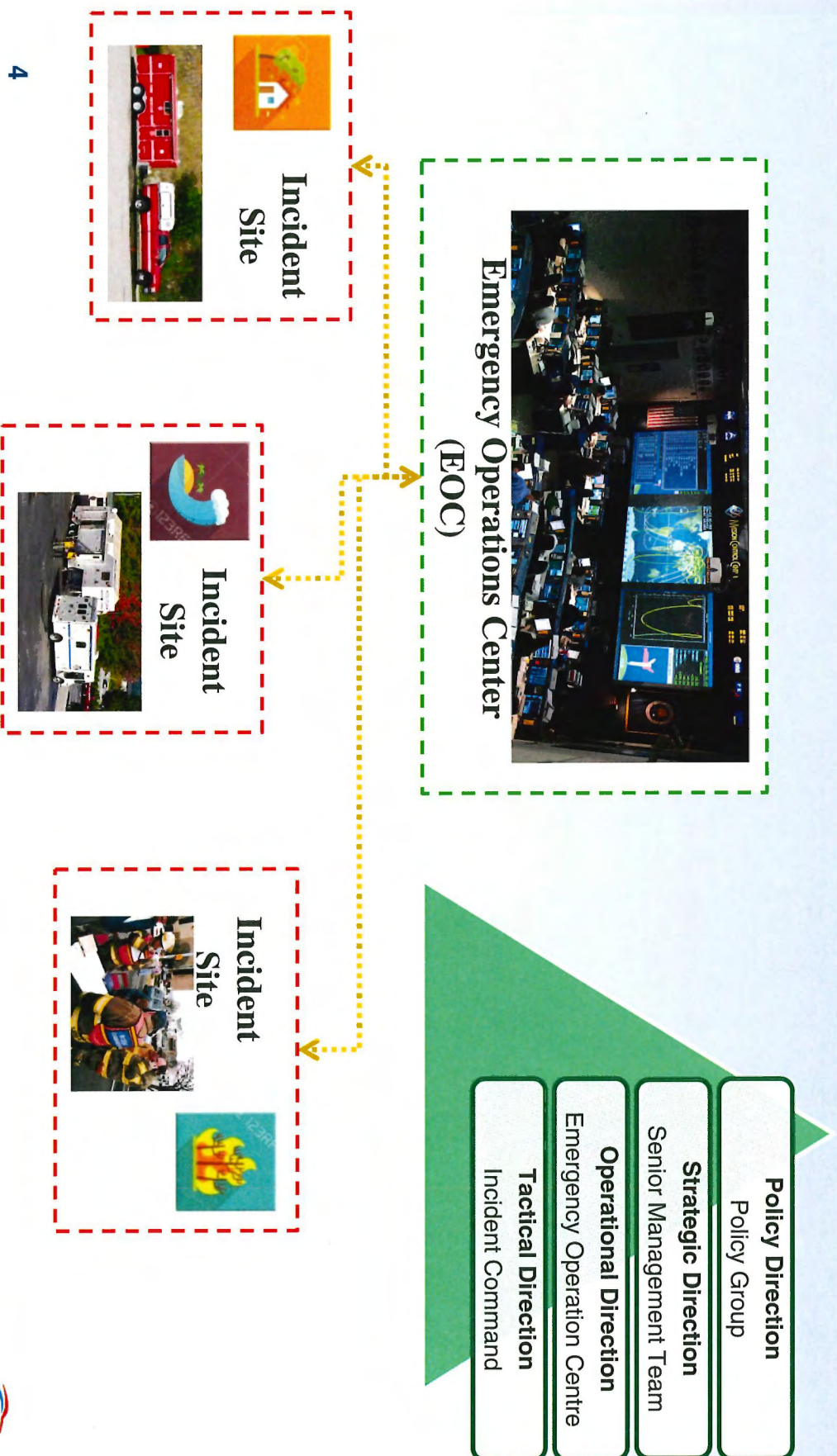

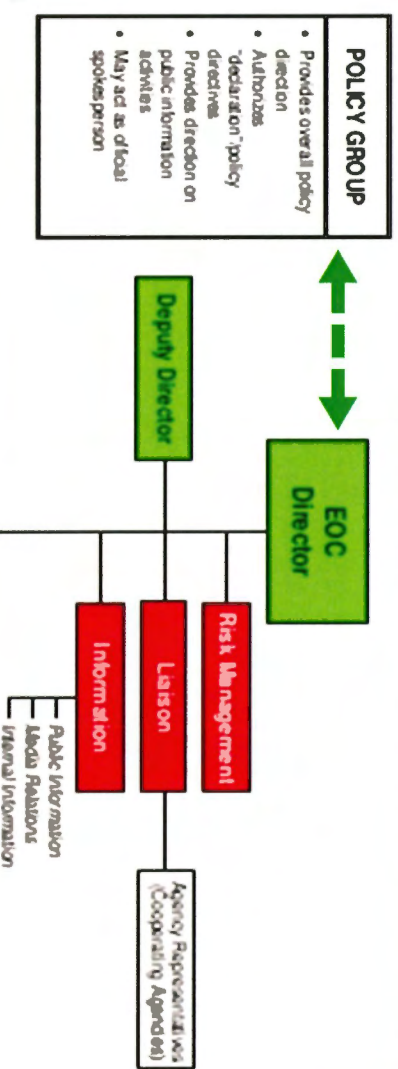
The Role of Council: Provide Policy Direction

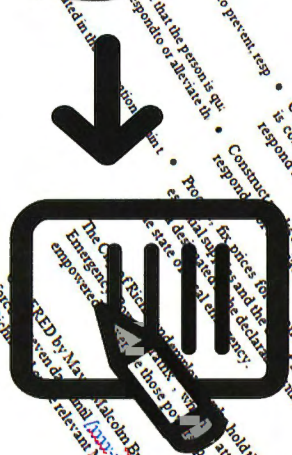

Order/Resolution

Declaration of State of Local Emergency

WHEREAS *(type of hazard)* in the City of Richmond;

AND WHEREAS *(type of hazard)* emergency requires prompt coordination of action or special regulation of persons or property to protect the health, safety or welfare of people or to limit damage to property;

NOW THEREFORE:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED pursuant to Section 12 (1) of the Emergency Program, 1996, Chap 111 that a state of local emergency exists as *(specific geographic area)* to *(short worded description of short consequence statement)*.

THE ORDER:

HAD the City of Richmond, its employees, servants, a course of implementing an emergency, plan or program or if otherwise considered by the local authority to be necessary or appropriate to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of an emergency or disaster.

Provision for the restoration of essential facilities and the distribution of essential supplies and provide, maintain and coordinate emergency medical, welfare and other essential services in any part of the local authority's jurisdiction.

Cause the evacuation of persons and the removal of livestock, animal and personal property from any are designated in the declaration within the local authority's jurisdiction that is or may be affected by an emergency or a disaster and make arrangements for the adequate care and protection of those persons, livestock, animals and personal property.

Authorize the entry into any building or on any land without warrant, by any person in the course of implementing an emergency, plan or program or if otherwise considered by the local authority to be necessary or appropriate to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of an emergency or disaster.

Cause the demolition or removal of any trees, structures or crops if the demolition or removal is considered by the local authority to be necessary or appropriate to prevent, respond to or alleviate the effects of an emergency or disaster.

Construct or cause to be constructed any food, clothing, fuel, equipment, medical supplies or other property, services, resources or equipment within any that the local authority's jurisdiction for the duration of the emergency.

Hold the positions shown on Schedule A- "Delegation of powers" attached and forms part of this resolution order, are specifically noted.

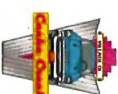
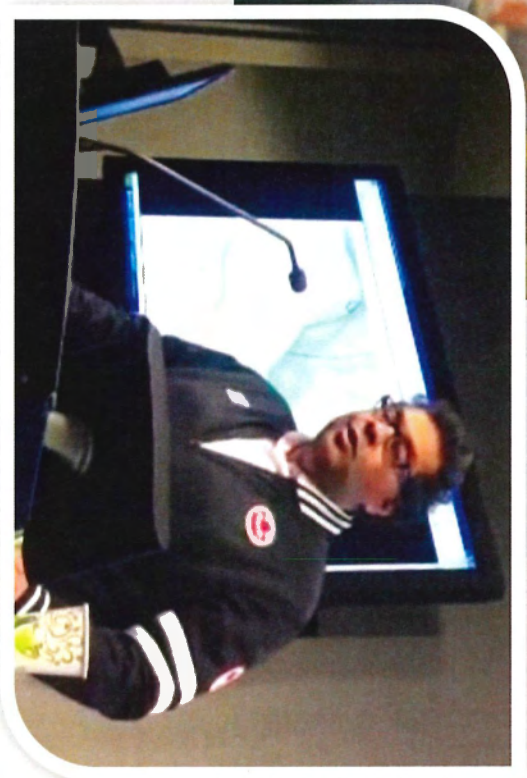
