#### **Staff Report**

## Origin

This report deals with a request for the donation of surplus City assets.

City policy calls for the disposal of surplus City assets by donations be forwarded to Council for approval.

#### **Analysis**

Richmond Fire Rescue was approached several months ago by a local organization "Firefighters without Borders", about the possible donation of any surplus fire rescue equipment. Fire Fighters without Borders is a non-profit organization that donates used equipment and provides training to third world countries. Their most recent project is in El Salvador. The organization will be donating three used fire trucks to this country.

Over the years, Richmond Fire Rescue (RFR) has collected an inventory of equipment that has outlived its serviceable life with RFR due to age, technological change, change in standards and replacement upgrades. While much of the equipment is still in good working order, it is no longer used by RFR's and could be donated. Within the local fire service, this equipment no longer has any value.

This equipment includes such items as:

- old hoses
- nozzles
- hose appliances and adaptors
- electrical equipment (fans/lights)
- · medical equipment
- hose jumpers

On Sunday October 5<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 pm., Firefighters Without Borders BC will present the Consul General of El Salvador with the keys to a 105 ft Ladder truck, a fire engine, a small utility vehicle and a considerable amount of fire fighting equipment including that proposed to be donated by the City of Richmond. The vehicles and equipment will be delivered, in addition to a comprehensive training program in late October 2008.

#### **Financial Impact**

The financial impact of donating this equipment would be any lost revenue that may have been realized through the auction or sale of the equipment. Given the lack of demand for this equipment any revenue that would have been realized is minimal.

## Conclusion

Through donating our surplus equipment that is not used here to Firefighters Without Borders, Richmond would be supporting a worthy cause that may possibly save lives in a third world country.
