Dear Mr. Brunel:

It should be clarified that the City is not proposing to restrict the parking of recreational vehicles.

The proposed new Richmond Zoning Bylaw 8500 allows travel trailers and boats to be parked on the driveway of a single family residential lot.

If the travel trailer or boat is not located on the driveway (e.g., is located elsewhere in the front yard or in the side or rear yard), then the proposed new Bylaw requires that it be screened.
