Would this mean that a trailer parked on a driveway satisfy the "on-site parking"? 6.4.5. Travel trailers or boats should be stored or parked in a required on-site parking space. Where this is not the case, and the travel trailers or boats are visible from an adjacent site or from a public road other than a lane, the travel trailers or boats shall be screened by: a) an opaque landscape screen of trees or shrubs to a height of at least 1.8 m if located in the front yard; or b) a 2.0 m high solid fence if located in the rear yard or side yard.</p>
