The proposed new Zoning Bylaw can be found on the City's web site (<u>www.richmond.ca</u>) under City Services > Planning & Zoning > Current Planning Projects > Zoning Bylaw Update.

Section 6.4.5 on travel trailers and boats can be found on page 97 on this website link, which is page 6-3 of the proposed new Zoning Bylaw.

## It should be noted that:

- recreational vehicles can be parked in the driveway of a single-family lot;

- the proposed new screening provisions only apply if you don't park the recreational vehicle in the driveway;

- if the recreational vehicle is located in the front yard and not on the driveway, a 1.8 m (6 foot) high landscape screen would be required;

- if the recreational vehicle is located in the side yard or rear yard (not on the driveway), a 2.0 m (6.5 foot) high solid fence would be required;

- this fencing and screening would be located along the property line (not around the recreational vehicle).


