## Staff Report

### Origin

The Officer In Charge of the Richmond RCMP Detachment acknowledges and supports that the City of Richmond should be kept informed on matters pertaining to policing in the community and has developed a framework to provide regular reporting cycles.

### Noteworthy Files:

#### **Synthetic Drug Lab Located**

On March 5th, 2009, in partnership with Richmond Fire Rescue, B.C. Ambulance Service and Richmond RCMP Detachment, members from the RCMP Federal Drug Enforcement Branch executed a search warrant at 8433 Bennet Road. The subsequent search revealed what is believed to be a synthetic drug operation. The materials are yet to be analyzed, therefore it is unknown what drug was being produced. One male was arrested and remains in custody.

#### **Richmond Stabbing Assault Turns Deadly**

On March 12, 2009 a suspect was charged in connection to the stabbing death of 27 year old Tsz Yeung Wong of Richmond. The victim is not known to police and has no known links to drugs, organized crime or gangs. Evidence gathered to date suggests that this incident is domestic related.

The suspect, 25-year-old Di Lng Feng of Vancouver has been charged with one count of second degree murder. Feng was expected to appear this afternoon in Richmond Provincial Court.
