RE: Sturgeon Banks Eco Walkway

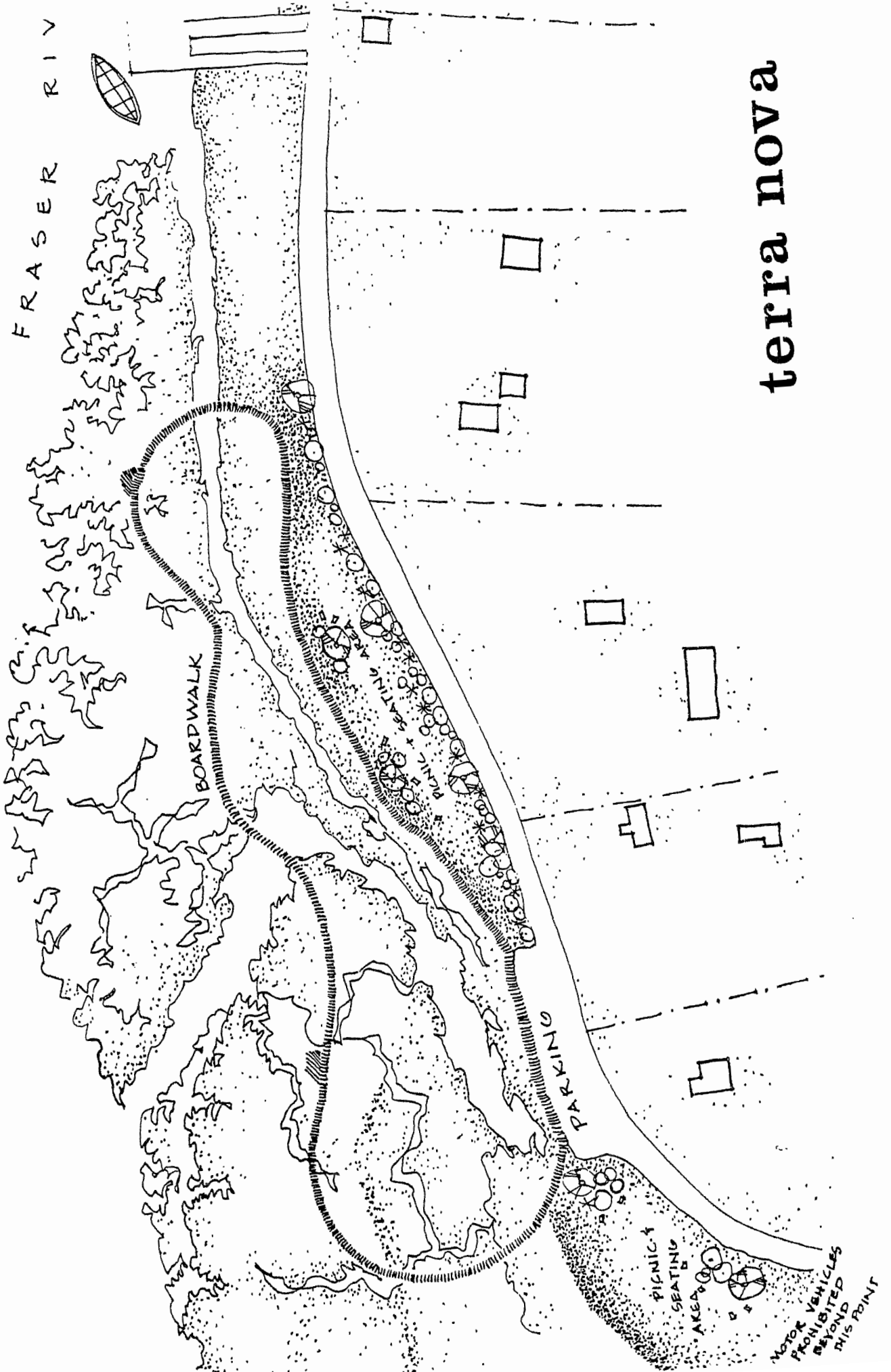
Recommendation:
