Staff Report

Origin

The City of Richmond's Sister City Advisory Committee (SCAC) was established on February 11, 1974 (formerly the Sister City Twinning Committee) and fosters mutual understanding and meaningful cultural connections with designated Sister/Friendship cities in the interests of Richmond citizens for their common benefit.

In accordance with the SCAC Terms of Reference, this report updates Council on work completed by the SCAC, in 2022, toward the 2019-2022 Activity Plan (Attachment 1) endorsed by Council on January 14, 2019.

This report supports Council's Strategic Plan 2022-2026 Focus Area #6 A Vibrant, Resilient, and Active Community:

Vibrant, resilient and active communities supported by a wide variety of opportunities to get involved, build relationships and access resources.

- 6.1 Advance a variety of program, services, and community amenities to support diverse needs and interests and activate the community.
- 6.3 Foster intercultural harmony, community belonging, and social connections.

Background

The role and purpose of the Sister City Advisory Committee (SCAC) is to provide advice to and assist Council with promoting the City's culture and values. The SCAC is also responsible for delivering the Sister City Program and pursuing the City's goal to establish and sustain cultural, educational and sustainable ties with approved Sister/Friendship Cities. Additionally, the SCAC will advise the City of any economic development, international trade and business opportunities presented to the Committee or its subcommittees arising from SCAC activities.

The City of Richmond has had a Sister City relationship with Pierrefonds, Quebec since 1967; Wakayama, Japan since 1973; and Xiamen, China since 2012. The City formed a Friendship City relationship with Qingdao, China in 2008.

Findings of Fact

Summary of 2022 Year in Review

In 2019, Council approved the Sister City Advisory Committee Four Year Activity Plan (2019-2022) (Attachment 1), which outlines the SCAC's work plan for that period. The 2022 SCAC Program Activity budget was \$60,000 and the Program Administration budget was \$11,000. The SCAC activities and events during 2022 are outlined in Attachment 2.

Some of the highlights from 2022 include:

- Pen Pal Program, January The City of Pierrefonds, Wakayama and Qingdao school boards partnered with the City of Richmond under the Sister City Program to connect students as pen pals through greeting cards, letters and emails. The Pen Pal Initiative was well received and over 130 students participated in the program. This was the first time Qingdao participated in a pen pal exchange.
- Celebrating 55th milestone anniversary with City of Pierrefonds, June/July –The mayors and select council members from City of Richmond and City of Pierrefonds met to celebrate the milestone anniversary at the Federation of Canadian Municipalities. On July 29, the day of the anniversary, the community participated in a Walk Richmond walk from City Hall to the Pierrefonds garden at the Minoru Chapel. Throughout 2022, six street banners were installed featuring the image of a landmark in Pierrefonds and included alternate English and French text.
- Steveston Salmon Festival, July The SCAC participated in its first in-person City event since August 2019. The goal was to share information with the public about the Sister City Program through fun trivia questions and everyone who visited the SCAC booth got to spin the new Japanese lottery wheel to receive a prize.
- Photo Exhibitions, April, July and October The Sister City Program experimented with a variety of photo exhibitions at the Cultural Centre. These were collaborations with our sister cities to celebrate the 10th milestone anniversary with Xiamen in April and 55th milestone anniversary with Pierrefonds in July. Additionally, in collaboration with the Richmond Public Library, the SCAC celebrated Canadian Libraries Month in October, showcasing photos of all Sister/Friendship City public libraries.
- Virtual Dialogue, year-long Virtual dialogues with our city contacts continued in 2022, including meetings between committee members and Pierrefonds, Wakayama, Xiamen, and Qingdao. The committee also communicated with the City of Vancouver, the City of Baltimore, Maryland, and the Sunshine Coast, Queensland, Australia to share best practices.

Looking Ahead to 2023

Work is well underway for Sister City Program activities in 2023. The activities planned for this year include:

- Continuing virtual information exchanges including:
 - o a pilot virtual city tour and cooking demos;
 - o an active living info exchange on hockey; and
 - continuing the virtual student Pen Pal Exchanges with Pierrefonds, Wakayama and Qingdao.
- Participating in City events throughout the year to commemorate the 50th
 Anniversary of Sister City relationship with Wakayama and the 15th Anniversary of Friendship City relationship with Qingdao.

- Celebrating the 50th Anniversary of Sister City relationship with Wakayama, including: unveiling the "Look up" Street Banner in March and a Walk Richmond walk in July.
- Exploring a "One Book for Kids" StoryWalk® for preschoolers/early elementary grade children. Intended as an interactive way to share stories about Richmond's Sister and Friendship cities, a StoryWalk® is designed to promote literacy and physical activity among young children. Children and adults would walk along a path in a local community park discovering pages of a children's picture book on a post to read aloud. Richmond Public Library recently launched a StoryWalk® in Mclean Neighbourhood Park in Hamilton.
- Supporting and encouraging in-person events including:
 - Supporting 21 students from Richmond's Japanese Language Program participating in Japan Bowl; and
 - Supporting a Richmond Girls Softball team to travel to Wakayama for a tournament and tour of the Sister City.

Financial Impact

None.

Conclusion

The SCAC 2019-2022 Four Year Activity Plan provided a structure to deliver events and activities to further strengthen the existing sister and friendship city relationships. Although the COVID-19 pandemic continued to cause a disruption to the 2022 SCAC Activity Plan, momentum was not lost. Planned activities pivoted to virtual and conversations have resulted in a resiliency to strengthen the sister/friendship relationships with activities within reach for 2023 and beyond.







 In early 2021, the Sister City Program launched a street banner photo contest in Pierrefonds, similar to the photo contest held in Richmond. Pierrefonds resident, Ginette Biron's photo of the Centre Local De Services Communautaires (the Local Community Service Centre) was selected as the winner! This building provides health and social services to the residents of Pierrefonds.

The "Look Up" street banner was created to celebrate the 55th milestone anniversary between the City of Richmond and the City of Pierrefonds. The cities twinned on July 29, 1967. Six street banners were installed on Granville Avenue between No. 3 Road and Minoru Boulevard, outside Richmond City Hall. The banners had alternating wording in both English and French.

The documents that were photographed include signed twinning documents for Pierrefonds (1967) and Wakayama (1973) plus various historically significant documents such as letters establishing the Sister City Twinning Committee in February 1974.

April

- The SCAC partnered with the organizers of the Cherry Blossom Festival and highlighted the historical connection between Richmond and Wakayama as sister cities through a blog post coauthored by the City of Wakayama city contact. The full post can be found here:

- Twenty-six students from a Grade 6/7 class from General Currie Elementary School paired with 40 students from a Grade 5/6 class from Qingdao Hengshan Road Elementary School to exchange emails in English. This was the first pen pal program with Qingdao.
- The SCAC initiated phase 1 of a full-scale redesign of the Sister City Program webpages on the City of Richmond's website. The schools in Wakayama have already declined to travel to Canada in 2023 so we hope an in-person connection will happen in 2024.
