Staff Report

Origin

The following report was first presented to General Purposes on February 5th, 2007 and was referred back to staff for additional information. All sections of this report in italics are additions, and the non-italicized parts are the same as presented on February 5th, 2007.

City Council has the authority to provide financial assistance to community organizations under the Local Government Act. The City of Richmond Grants Policy 3705 (Attachment 1) outlines the principles and processes by which the grants are to be allocated.

On February 5th, 2007, General Purposes Committee received the 2007 City Grants Program report (Attachment 1) and moved the following:

That the report (dated January 24th, 2007, from the Manager of Policy Planning), regarding the 2007 City Grants be referred to staff to:

- (1) provide comments on the merits of the Multicultural Helping House Society grant application and on the category to which the application had been assigned;
- (2) provide comments on the CARS grant application;
- (3) provide additional comments on the merits of the VIP grant application;
- (4) (a) provide comments on the merits of the Kajaks Track and Field Club grant application, and to clarify why staff were recommending that a grant not be approved;
 - (b) examine all sporting groups with similar requests to the Kajaks Track and Field Club, and give consideration to the preparation of a policy and/or guidelines for this type of application; and
 - (c) provide an explanation on the purpose of the City Grants budget;
- (5) provide comments on the Richmond Responsible Dog Owner's Group grant application;
- (6) provide comments on the Chinese Mental Wellness Association of Canada grant application.

Information pertaining to this motion is provided in Analysis, below (Analysis, Section 6).

Findings Of Fact

1. Grants Budget

The 2007 Grants Budget is \$500,000.00

2. Applications Received

Advertisements were placed on the City Page and City Notice Board in the Richmond Review and on the City website in August and September, 2006 advising the community of the grants process and the closing date for applications of October 13, 2006.

A total of 43 applications were received for a requested total of \$960,361 as follows:

Requests amount to 192% of the budget.

A summary of requests for the 2007 Grants Program is included as **Attachment 2**.

3. Late Applications

Of the 43 applications received, two were received after the October 13th, 2006 deadline.

Staff has not recommended grants to these organizations as it clearly states on the application form that "late submissions will not be considered".

Multicultural Helping House Society was a new applicant last year. The VIP Club has been receiving City Grants since at least 1993.

4. Two Categories of Grant Applications

The City's Grants Policy defines two eligible categories for applicants:

- <u>Category 1</u> applicants are those "providing unique and essential services to the community of Richmond". Applicants who are deemed to be Category 1 may apply for funding in subsequent years. All 43 applications in 2007 were deemed to be Category 1.
- <u>Category 2</u> applicants are not eligible to apply for or receive funding for two subsequent years. No 2007 applications were designated Category 2.

For 2007 funding, only one application was received from an organization deemed Category 2 in 2006:

- Multicultural Helping House Society (MHHS), requesting \$20,000.00

The reasons for not recommending funding to MHHS in 2007 are:

- in accordance with the Policy, this applicant would not be eligible to apply for or receive funding for two subsequent years.
- this was also a late application.

A Grants Policy review currently underway (see Analysis, #5) will include an assessment of the usefulness of the Category 2 designation.

Seven (7) new applications were received for the 2007 Grants Program, as follows:

Staff members were assigned applications to review and completed the Grant Application Summary Sheets (**Attachment 3**) attached to this report. Recommended allocations were determined by the Committee.

Analysis

1. Summary of Grant Applications

The attached Grant Application Summary Sheets (**Attachment 3**) summarize each application with respect to the purpose of the request, services received from the City, use of previous year's grant, financial status, and recommended grant. A binder of the full 2007 Grant Applications has been placed in the Councillors' Lounge.

Youth CounterAttack and RoadSense Society of BC (CARS) Withdrawal: One summary sheet has been revised since the February 5th, 2007 General Purposes meeting: that of Youth CounterAttack and RoadSense Society of BC (CARS), who have withdrawn their application because they have closed. [This makes \$1,000 available].

^{*}Youth CounterAttack and RoadSense of BC (CARS) withdrew their application as of February 12th, 2007; leaving 42 applications for consideration at February 19th, 2007 General Purposes Meeting.

The Grants Budget was increased from \$316,500 in 2005 to \$500,000 in 2006. Most of the difference was allocated to Richmond Addiction Services to provide both substance abuse (Youth Outreach Counsellor) and problem gambling prevention programs.

3. Summary of Reasons for Partial or No Funding

Partial funding of requests is typically recommended because requests exceed the capacity of the Grants Program budget to fully fund. As almost all applications are only partially funded, partial funding does not necessarily imply any criticism of a program or organization. The primary reason for partial funding is that the total amount requested exceeds the Grants Program budget.

Other reasons for partial or no payment may include:

- Programs have previously been funded by other levels of government
- Funding responsibility lies in other jurisdictions
- Other funding partners have not been sought (e.g., looking to City as sole source)
- Not partnering with other organizations
- Insufficient community benefit demonstrated
- Unaccounted for or an available surplus
- Fee-based (user pay) budget should be used
- City provides other forms of support to organization.

4. Restorative Justice Program (Touchstone Application)

The Province has been supporting restorative justice programs in two ways:

(1) Restorative Justice Programs:

To assist people after they go to Court, the BC Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General funds Restorative Justice approaches. This funding continues.

(2) Richmond Youth Restorative Justice Program

- To assist Richmond youth (e.g., first offenders) before they go to court, the Richmond RCMP and Touchstone Family Association signed an MOU in Dec. 2003, to deliver a youth restorative justice program. Richmond's Law and Community Safety Department, [Youth Intervention Program] support the program. It was funded by the

RCMP, Touchstone and the Province (BC Ministry of Children and Family Development [MCFD]). MCFD provided one time direct pilot funding of \$5,000 and another one time \$17,000 which was from another program source.

- These dollars are now spent. The City supports, but has not funded the Program.

Touchstone has applied for \$95,000 funding, annually, to support the ongoing coordination of the Richmond Restorative Justice Program.

The Grants Program does not have sufficient resources to fully fund programs on an annual or ongoing basis.

Staff recommend that:

- for 2007, a grant of \$15,000 be approved to assist Touchstone while other funding sources are explored, and
- Council write the BC Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General, and the BC Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD), and ask them to fully fund the program, as the Province has a responsibility towards youth restorative justice.

As well, the City's Law and Community Safety staff will explore ways that the program might be supported.

5. Review of Grant Policy 3075

A review of the Grants Policy (**Attachment 1**) is being led by Cllrs. Evelina Halsey Brandt and Linda Barnes. Staff participating in the review are Anne Stevens, Cathy Russell, Terry Crowe and Lesley Sherlock. Suggestions from the 2007 Grant Applications Review Team have been forwarded to the Policy Review Team for consideration.

The Richmond Community Services Advisory Committee and the Council of Community Associations will be consulted in the review of the Grants Policy to seek ways to make it effective and user-friendly.

A staff report is anticipated in June 2007.

6. Information requested at February 5th, 2007 General Purposes

(1) Multicultural Helping House Society (MHHS) Background

MHHS Richmond opened in 2005. MHHS provides services to immigrants and low-income families including settlement counselling, employment assistance, support for individuals and families facing challenges, free legal clinic and information and referral. Also, MHHS works with the youth in community organizing, leadership development, education and outreach on youth integration, anti-racism and other issues. It also provides support to seniors in accessing services and to continue to become active members of the community.

In 2006, MHHS applied for a City Grant of \$25,000 and was awarded \$10,000 for operating expenses.

MHHS applied for a 2007 City Grant of \$20,000 for operating expenses and was not recommended because the application was received after the October 13th, 2006 deadline.

On October 24, MHHS became aware of the missed deadline and contacted City staff who advised that late applications, while not recommended for funding, are forwarded to Council for review. A complete but late application package was received from MHHS on November 1, 2006.

Merits of the Application

- request is for operating assistance which enables MHHS to offer a wide variety of programs and services to the Richmond community, as identified above,
- services offered are important to a culturally diverse community such as Richmond,
- serves smaller cultural groups for whom fewer culturally-sensitive services are available,
- MHHS offers new programs (e.g. the Maple Bamboo Initiative: Training Newcomers in Public Involvement).

Category Designation

- In 2006, MHHS was designated Category 2, which would render them ineligible for funding in 2007 (Policy 3705, Attachment 1)
- In 2007, MHHS was designated Category 1, deemed a unique and essential service and therefore eligible to apply again next year. The designation was changed due to the types of services and innovative programs that this organization offers, and the needs of their target groups.

Conclusion

- As the application form clearly states that late applications will not be considered, staff are not recommending funding.
- Should Council wish to allocate a grant, staff suggest that a grant of \$10,000 (\$20,000 requested) may be considered (same level as last year).

(2) Youth CounterAttack and RoadSense Society of BC (CARS)

On February 12th, 2007, CARS staff indicated that they are withdrawing their application for funding because the organization is closing. Therefore, the \$1,000 grant to CARS is no longer recommended.

(3) Visually Impaired People's Club of Richmond (VIP) Background

The VIP Club was formed in 1989 to offer support, information and recreation for blind and visually impaired adults in Richmond. They hold monthly meetings featuring guest speakers, subsidize pottery classes for members, organize recreational activities, and provide transportation for members to attend VIP events.

Records going back to 1993 show that the VIP Club has received City Grants since that time on an annual basis. In 2006, they applied for and received \$1,500.

In 2007, the VIP submitted a late application, received on October 30, 2006, requesting \$1,500 to cover office rental. The reason for the late application is that the VIP President was experiencing health problems and had recently been hospitalized.

Merits

- VIP provides social and recreational activities for blind and visually impaired Richmond residents.
- VIP occasionally provides office space to the Canadian Institute for the Blind (CNIB) so that members do not have to travel to Vancouver for CNIB services.

- VIP undertakes fund-raising activities to help support their activities.
- VIP operates on a minimal budget of under \$5,000.00.

Conclusion

- As the application form clearly states that late applications will not be considered, staff are not recommending funding.
- Should Council wish to allocate a grant, staff suggest that a grant of \$1,500 (\$1,500 requested) may be considered (same level as last year).

(4) Kajaks

Background

Kajaks is a recreational and high-level performance track and field club based at the Clement Track in Minoru Park. Kajaks has over 200 members. They provide high quality training in track disciplines and host several races per year.

City Grants records dating from 1993 indicate that Kajaks applied for but was denied a City Grant in 1993. They did not apply again until this year.

Kajak's 2007 Grant Application is for \$15,000 for equipment replacement. Staff did not recommend a grant to this organization (see reasons below).

Merits

- Kajaks offers an opportunity for structured exercise to all residents of Richmond
- Kajaks equipment and concession stand are used by over 8,000 Richmond school students
- Kajaks is Richmond's only track and field club
- Kajaks provides high-level performance coaches and prepares athletes to compete at national and international levels, including the Olympics.

Rationale For Denying Grant

- Kajaks is primarily a member-serving organization
- The equipment purchased with the grant would be for members' rather than public use,
- The proposed use of grant funds was specified for less than \$5,000 of the \$15,000 request,
- Kajaks has \$40,000 in reserve funds designated for equipment replacement and hiring a coach.

All Sporting Groups with Similar Requests to Kajaks

No other sporting groups with similar requests applied to the 2007 City Grants program.

Prior to 2007, similar organizations applying for grants and Council decisions are as follows:

- In 2000, the <u>Richmond Tennis Club</u> applied for \$50,000 to complete their clubhouse, was denied a grant, and was classified as Category 2. In addition to being a late application, the rationale for denial was that, although the organization provided an opportunity to Richmond residents to play tennis, "the Tennis Club has the opportunity to approach their membership for additional funding to complete the clubhouse". They have not applied since.

- In 2001, the <u>Richmond Gymnastics Association</u> applied for \$4,829 for equipment and was awarded \$1,500. They applied again in 2005 for equipment, were denied a grant based on the rational that the organization has sufficient funding in their accumulated surplus to cover the expenses, and were classified as Category 2 (ineligible to receive for 2 consecutive years, until 2007). This group did not apply in 2007.
- While not applying directly to the Grants Program, in 2003 the <u>Steveston Judo Club</u> sought City support for their 50th Anniversary celebration. In September 2003, the Club was awarded \$5,500 from the remainder of the 2003 Grants budget, on a one-time only basis, for the publication of their 50th Anniversary Memory Book.

No other comparable requests have been made of the City Grants program since 1993.

Policy/Guidelines for this type of Application

The Preparation of a policy and/or guidelines for this type of application will be addressed in the upcoming 2008 Grants Policy.

Conclusion

The history of Council decisions pertaining to membership-based sports organizations indicates that the City expects such organizations to be self-supporting in terms of equipment supply.

Although recognizing their significant contribution to Richmond athletics, staff do not recommend that a grant be awarded to the Kajaks Track and Field Club (see reasons above).

Should Council wish to allocate a grant, staff suggest that a grant of \$2,500 (\$15,000 requested) may be considered to assist with equipment purchase, on a one-time only basis.

(5) Richmond Responsible Dog Owner's Group (RRDOG) Background

RRDOG is a non-profit volunteer advocacy group whose purpose is to establish a culture of socially acceptable dog management standards, etiquette and behaviour beneficial to everyone. They have approximately 50 members.

RRDOG has applied to the 2007 City Grants Program for \$26,000 for operating costs, projects and programs and services. They have never before applied for a City Grant.

Merits

- RRDOG appears to fill a unique role in Richmond by advocating on behalf of dog owners
- RRDOG strives to ensure appropriate dog behaviour in public places
- RRDOG is a grassroots initiative started by Richmond dog owners.

Rationale For Denving Grant

- \$20,300 of request is for copying & mailing of brochures, surveys and membership forms to all licensed dog owners in Richmond, but the requested access to the City's mailing list of registered dog owners or inclusion in City mailing is not permitted by the City
- \$2,000 of request is for website design and maintenance but staff feel that members should explore ways of reducing and bearing the cost

- \$3,700 of request is for operational expenses (previously donated by members), reference materials (may be available on web), expanded presence at dog-related events, (e.g., Pet Wellness Expo. although attendance at conferences, etc. not funded by City Grants Program), and liaising with other groups.

Staff feel that this organization needs to further explore partnerships. In addition, RRDOG has not requested funding from other sources for 2007.

Conclusion

As staff consider that expenses have not been fully justified and that two principles of the City Grants policy (partnerships and seeking funding from a range of sources) have not been sufficiently demonstrated, staff do not recommend a grant for 2007.

Should Council wish to allocate a grant, staff suggest that a grant of \$1,000 (\$26,000 requested) for operating expenses be considered from the 2007 City Grants Budget.

(6) Chinese Mental Wellness Association of Canada (CMWAC) Background

CMWAS provides a no-fee, fast access ethnic-match mental wellness professional counselling, wellness line, and peer support to Richmond residents, including a Chinese Peer Support Volunteer Program. Of the 1,680 people served by their organization, 1,452 are Richmond residents.

History

- CMWAS applied to the 2007 City Grants Program for \$40,900. Of this request, \$12,000 was for operating expenses, with the remainder for support programs and services. Staff recommended a grant of \$7,400 to fund the Choir of Love Program.
- In 2002, CMWAS first applied to the City Grants program (as the Richmond Chinese Mental Health Support Group), requesting \$7,000 for programs and services. The organization was not awarded a grant on the basis that other community organizations provided similar programs and services.
- In 2003, CMWAS requested \$23,000 for operating expenses, programs and services and was awarded \$5,000.
- In 2004, CMWAS applied for \$51,860 for programs and services and was awarded \$5,000.
- In 2005, CMWAS applied for \$25,000 for programs and services and was awarded \$5,000.
- In 2006, CMWAS applied for \$30,000 for operating assistance, programs and services, and was awarded \$12,000 "to continue offering this unique service that bridges the gaps between the multicultural groups and mainstream society".

Merits

- offers culturally sensitive and appropriate mental health services for non-English speakers
- provides alternative for clients wanting to avoid the stigma of seeking professional help from traditional sources
- seeks funding from a range of sources and conducts fund-raising activities.

Rationale For Recommended Grant

- the Choir of Love Program seems to provide a unique opportunity for Chinese-speaking people living with mental illness
- while receiving referrals from and co-organizing events with other agencies, partnering with other organizations to provide quality services was not demonstrated in the application
- staff sought clarification of partners' roles and contact information but did not receive this information in time to be considered for this report.

Conclusion

Staff recommend that a grant of \$7,400 for the Choir of Love Program be provided to CMWAS as it seems to provide a unique social opportunity for Chinese-speaking people living with mental illness.

(7) Summary

In summary, should Council wish to allocate grants to the following organizations from the 2007 City Grants budget, staff suggest that the following be considered:

- 1. Multicultural Helping House Society, a change from \$0 to \$10,000,
- 2. Visually Impaired People's Club, a change from \$0 to \$1,500,
- 3. Kajaks, a change from \$0 to \$2,500, on a one-time only basis,
- 4. Richmond Responsible Dog Owner's Group, a change from \$0 to \$1,000,
- 5. Chinese Mental Wellness Association of Canada, maintain the initial recommendation of \$7,400.

The initially recommended allocation of \$1,000 to the Youth CounterAttack and RoadSense Society of BC is to be omitted.

Financial Impact

The 2007 Grants Program has a budget of \$500,000.00

Conclusion

The recommended grant allocations fall within the budget of the 2007 Grant Program.

The City Grants program contributes significantly to the quality of life in Richmond by supporting community organizations whose programs and activities make Richmond a livable community.

POLICY 3705:

It is Council policy that:

The principles on which grant funding will be approved are as follows:

A. GENERAL PRINCIPLES:

The City of Richmond supports the enhancement of a positive quality of life for all its residents, and the Council recognizes that one method of helping to achieve this goal is through an annual grants program.

Applications from non-profit or registered charitable organizations and/or groups are eligible for a City grant on the basis that they:

- offer projects, programs, services or events which have a demonstrated need in the community;
- provide the greatest benefits to the largest number of Richmond residents;
- exercise co-ordination and co-operation with other groups to prevent duplication of projects, programs, services or events;
- provide evidence of having sought funding from a variety of sources;
- promote volunteer participation and citizen involvement;
- apply a "user pay" philosophy, where applicable;
- use innovative approaches and techniques in addressing community issues;
- provide documentation supporting the financial need for funding, including, but not limited, to the current financial statements of the applicant;
- show real and financial need, and demonstrate the impact that would occur following non-funding from the City;

and on the understanding, that:

- Not all organizations meeting these general principles will automatically receive a grant or grant increase.
- Approval of a grant by the City in any particular year should not be viewed as an automatic ongoing source of annual funding. Grant renewals are not automatic,

nor is any increase in funds. Grant approvals in a particular year, do not guarantee that grant requests in subsequent years will be successful.

• Only one application per year will be accepted per organization.

B. DEFINITIONS OF ELIGIBLE GRANT CATEGORIES:

1. Category 1 and Category 2 Applicants – Applicable category for any application to be determined by Council.

Applicants may apply for Category 1 or Category 2 designation as follows:

<u>Category 1</u> applicants must be deemed to be providing unique and essential services to the community of Richmond. Applicants must demonstrate how their services fit under this designation. Applicants who are deemed to be Category 1 may apply for funding in subsequent years; and

<u>Category 2</u> applicants who receive funding would not be eligible to apply or receive funding for two subsequent years.

2. Operating Assistance

Regular operating expenses or core budgets of established organizations, including supplies and equipment, heat, light, telephone, photocopying, rent, and administrative support salaries.

3. Projects

One-time-only projects which respond to health, social and cultural needs within Richmond, must have a specific set of goals and objectives, and have a defined start and finish date.

4. Programs and Services

Ongoing programs and services which contribute to the health and social well-being of Richmond residents, or which contribute to the general interest and advantage of the City.

5. Events (Community Promotion)

Events which enhance and contribute to the cultural life of Richmond, which promote community involvement and spirit, and which have a defined start and finishing date (but may also be held annually), and which promote Richmond outside the City.

6. Council Discretion

Council may, at its discretion, award grants to groups which offer a service deemed by Council to be of value to the City, or to community committees whose mandate is to function for the good of the City and its residents.

C. EXCLUSIONS FROM ELIGIBILITY FOR CITY GRANT:

- Applications from individuals
- Activities which are restricted to people of specific religious or ethnic groups
- Annual fund-raising campaigns, form letter requests or telephone campaigns
- Building funds or capital construction campaigns
- Debt retirement
- Expenses related to attendance at seminars, workshops, symposiums, or conferences
- Agencies which primarily fund other organizations

D. GRANTS REVIEW CONSIDERATIONS

Not all organizations meeting the criteria will automatically receive a grant. Grant allocations are dependent on the Grants budget established by City Council.

In reviewing grant applications and preparing recommendations for grant allocations, Council may give primary consideration to the following factors:

- Basic eligibility and demonstrates organizational efficiency, effectiveness and stability.
- numbers of Richmond residents served
- quality of service
- financial need of the organization
- community interaction
- role and number of volunteers
- use of existing community services and facilities
- local input into governance
