The establishment of a Public Assisted Living Facility on this site is a vital step in the development of care for Richmond residents who can no longer fully care for themselves. For those residents who are very close to the end of their lives great changes are in progress. The Palliative Care Ward at The Richmond Hospital has recently undergone a major re-development and the Rotary/Salvation Army Hospice will be opening within a few weeks. Similarly, the number of Complex Care beds in Richmond for residents who need significant, continuous support is being increased very significantly by projects which are either in progress or to be started soon. Unfortunately, at this time there are no public, Assisted Living beds in Richmond for residents who can no longer live in their own homes but are largely independent.
